Milwaukie Common Council, 1905

Four months after the state legislature incorporated the Town of Milwaukie the first Common (later City) Council meeting was called to order on June 2, 1903 by Mayor William Shindler in rented space on the corner of Main and Jefferson. Since the beginning the Mayor and four Councilors have been elected at-large to four-year terms and are charged with setting policy for all municipal activities, primarily through consideration and adoption of ordinances and resolutions. Since 1945 Milwaukie has

had a Council-Manager form of government, with the Council-appointed City Manager administering City operations and executing City policies.

Work Sessions are held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month in the City Hall Conference Room at 5 p.m.

Regular Sessions are held on the first and third Tuesdays of each month in the City Hall Council Chambers at 7 p.m.

Study Sessions are held on the third Thursday of each month in the City Hall Conference Room at 5 p.m.

The Mayor, or in the Mayor's absence the Council President, presides over Council meetings which are conducted in accordance with *Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised Edition*.

The Agenda

The Council considers matters in the order of the printed agenda. All agenda items must be submitted to the Office of the City Recorder eleven (11) days prior to the regularly scheduled Council meeting. Submitted items are then reviewed by the Mayor and City Manager and may be scheduled to appear on a Council agenda. Agenda item sponsors will be notified if their matter will appear before the Council, as not all submitted agenda items are scheduled.

Agendas are available to the public the Tuesday before Regular Sessions online at www.milwaukieoregon.gov/meetings. Printed agendas are also made available at City Hall, the Ledding Library, and at the Johnson Creek Permit Center. Speaking at Council Meetings

The City of Milwaukie welcomes and encourages all citizens to express their views to their city leaders in a respectful and appropriate manner. There are three opportunities during a Regular Session meeting for the public to speak before the Council; these agenda items are noted below. If you wish to speak during a Regular Session, complete and hand to the City Recorder a [green registration card](#) on the table outside the Council Chambers, or to submit a card via email, visit www.milwaukieoregon.gov/cityrecorder/public-meetings. During the meeting, when called upon:

- Come forward to the testimony table
- Speak clearly into the microphone
- Begin by stating **your name** and **city of residence**
- Then briefly state your views

Following your statement, the Council may want to ask you questions, so wait for a moment before returning to your seat.

Agenda Item #4 Audience Participation: to speak on topics not on the agenda. The Mayor will ask for oral requests and communications from the audience. Be aware that final Council action on your request, at this meeting, is unlikely because the necessary ordinance, resolution, or background information will not have been prepared. It is the Council's wish that matters not on the agenda first be pursued with the responsible city department. The City Manager will report at the following regular Council meeting about any action that has been taken on items introduced during Audience Participation.

Agenda Item #5 Public Hearing (if scheduled): to speak on a scheduled hearing topic. The Mayor will identify the subject and announce the opening of the hearing. The Mayor will then ask for those in favor of the proposal to speak, then those opposed, and finally for any other comments. The Mayor will announce when the hearing is closed, and there will be no further testimony. Any correspondence regarding a public hearing must be submitted by 4 p.m. the day of the Council meeting. Any correspondence submitted after that time may not be available for consideration by Council.

Agenda Item #6 Other Business: to speak on a scheduled Other Business topic. After a City staff person or other presenter gives their report, the Mayor will ask for any public comments if any have been identified through the [green registration cards](#) located in the hallway. Any correspondence regarding an Other Business agenda item must be submitted by 4 p.m. the day of the Council meeting.
