ORDINANCE NO. ~~29~~ (Twenty Nine)

AN ORDINANCE to regulate to running at large of both male and female dogs by license, and to repeal Ordinance No. 19.

Milwaukie Does Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to own, keep or harbor any male or female dog within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, unless the said animal shall be provided with and have attached to a collar about its neck at all times, a metal tag, which tag shall have impressed or legibly displayed upon it the number of the license regularly issued as hereinafter set forth, and all stray dogs shall be taken up and disposed of in like manner as is hereinafter specified for the disposition of all dogs for which no license shall have been secured.

Section 2. Licenses and tags shall issue to each owner or keeper of dogs as follows: Male dogs, three months or more of age, \$2 each. Female dogs or "Bitches" three months or more of age, \$4 each, upon the payment to the treasurer of the said Town of Milwaukie the said sums, presenting the receipts to the Recorder of the said town of Milwaukie, he or she shall receive the tag above mentioned which tag shall be attached to the dog by collar, and no dog or dogs, male or female, over the age of three months shall be allowed to run at large within the said town of Milwaukie not having the tag attached as above specified.

Section 3. The Marshal or Pound Master, or other officer of the said town of Milwaukee authorized to do so, shall take up any dog found running at large within the corporate limits of the said town, keep the said animal for a period of three days, during which time the owner thereof may have the right to redeem the animal so impounded and taken up as hereinafter specified, and if not so redeemed within the period of three days, he the said Marshal, pound master or other authorized person shall dispose of the said animal by destroying the same. Provided that no dog shall be taken up or impounded or destroyed

stroyed if it shall be shown to the satisfaction of the said taker up that the said animal is the property of a farmer or person temporarily within the city on business or visiting, in which case the said dog shall not be allowed to remain in the said town for a longer period than ~~three~~ ^{(6) six} hours, after which the said animal will be subject to this ordinance.

Section 4. At any time after the taking up of any dog and ^{before} the expiration of the three days above specified, the owner or other person for him, may redeem the said animal, by paying the fees taxed, as specified hereinafter, and an additional sum of \$1.50, together with the amount of the license above specified.

Section 5. The Poundmaster or other person authorized shall receive from the owner or other person for each dog so redeemed, the sum of twenty-five cents for taking up, and ten cents per day for feeding the same, which sums shall be retained by him. The penalty above mentioned to-wit \$1.50 shall be with the regular license money turned over to the town treasurer, and receipts taken for the same, the license receipt taken by the redeemer of the dog to the town recorder who will take up the said receipt and issue a tag as above mentioned.

Section 6. In case it becomes necessary to destroy any dog so taken up, the said Pound master, or other person so authorized, shall receive from the Town of Milwaukie the ~~sum of~~ additional sum of 50 cents each for destroying ~~of~~ said dogs at the expiration of the three days time above mentioned for redemption.

Section 7. Upon the passage of this ordinance and its adoption, the former ordinance dealing with this subject, to-wit Ordinance No. 20 shall be and is hereby repealed.

Section 8. The Marshal of said town, or the person taking up said dogs, shall keep a correct record of the time of taking and description of animals, and the date of redemption or destruction, and also ~~the~~ an itemized statement of the fees and fines and license monies collected for each.
