ORDINANCE No. 7

Repealed by Ordinance 1021

June 16, 1964

An ordinance prohibiting the riding of bicycles on the sidewalks and public foot-paths of Milwaukie and regulating the use of bicycles on said sidewalks and foot-paths.

Passed July 14, 1904.

The Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, does ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride use or propel any bicycle ~~any~~ on any of the sidewalks or foot-paths in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the 1st of May of any year to the 1st of October of the same year, and it shall be unlawful for any person at any time to ride use or propel any bicycle on the sidewalks or foot-paths of said Town of Milwaukie faster than six miles per hour, and when any person is riding any bicycle on said sidewalks or foot paths he shall dismount ~~when passing~~ 15 feet before passing any pedestrian whom he should meet or desire to pass on the same walk or path.; except on proper crossings to go into or out of a yard; provided that the drawing or pushing of a bicycle shall be excepted from this ordinance.

Section No. 2. Any person violating this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before any court having jurisdiction shall be fined in a sum not less than \$1.00 or more than \$20.00 or by a imprisonment in the city jail not more than ten days.
