

ORDINANCE NUMBER 166.

An ordinance providing for the improvement of 24th. Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the north line of a sixteen foot pavement in Harrison Street thence northerly along the center line of said 24th. Street for a distance of five hundred and one (501) feet, more or less; repealing ordinance No. 165, and declaring an emergency.

MILWAUKIE DOES OPDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That 24th. Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, shall be improved from the north line of a sixteen foot pavement in Harrison Street thence northerly along the center line of said 24th. Street for a distance of five hundred and one (501) feet, more or less, in conformity to and in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the recorder of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and which were approved and adopted by Resolution of the Town Council on the 21st day of July, 1920.

Section. 2. That ordinance number 165 is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Whereas the said 24th. Street is in a dangerous condition, and its improvement is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the inhabitants thereof, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the mayor.

tracks located in the center or on the right hand side of the street shall have the right of way over other vehicles, except emergency vehicles and ambulances. Street and interurban cars shall have the right of way between cross streets over all vehicles, except emergency vehicles, and the driver of any vehicle proceeding upon the track in front of a street car shall immediately turn out upon signal by the motorman, driver or conductor of said street or interurban car. At all intersections the vehicle entering the intersection from the right of another vehicle entering said intersection shall have the right of way, except over an emergency vehicle or a street car..

Section 11. Emergency vehicles include fire and police vehicles and ambulances while on emergency calls and shall have the right of way at all places over all other vehicles and street and interurban cars. All vehicles and street and interurban cars shall be stopped and kept stationary upon the approach of fire apparatus so as not to obstruct said apparatus.

Section 12. It shall be unlawful to drive over fire hose or to drive or operate any vehicles or street or interurban car while intoxicated, or in reckless or negligent manner.

Section 13. All vehicles shall be operated so as to allow a safe distance between the front of such vehicle and the rear end of any proceeding vehicle. And the driver of any vehicle must comply with the direction or order to stop of any police or traffic officer.

Section 14. It shall be unlawful of any owner or person in charge or in possession of any motor vehicle to permit any person under the age of sixteen years to drive or operate such motor vehicle unless such person is accompanied by his or her parent or guardian in the front seat of such motor vehicle.

Section 15. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive or propel any vehicle, street or interurban car through a funeral procession.

Section 16. Vehicles standing without a driver shall be secured so that it cannot be moved without human action and machinery must be at a standstill. A machine shall not be locked so it cannot be moved. Every machine must have brakes in good condition.

Section 17. Drivers of all vehicles must report within 12 hours in person to the Marshal of all accidents to them or caused by them. All drivers of vehicles must have a clear and unobstructed view of traffic from the front side and rear of vehicle.

Section 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or trespass upon any vehicle without the consent of the driver.

Section 19. It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle with offensive exhaust or with muffler open.

Section 20. Every motor vehicle, except a motorcycle or bicycle, during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, while in motion, shall display at least two white lights on the front and one red light on the rear of the vehicle. Rear lamp shall show a white light upon the state license number plate.

Section 21. Every motor vehicle during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, while stopped or parked upon any street, shall display at least two white lights to the front and one red light on the rear, or display on the side

nearest the center of the street upon which it is parked or stopped a red or white light, which must be plainly visible from the front and rear of such vehicle for a distance of not less than 100 feet in either direction.

Section 22. Motorcycles and bicycles shall display a white light in front and a red light to the rear, such lights to be plainly visible at a distance of at least 200 feet; provided, however, motorcycles may use red reflex mirrors in lieu of a red light in rear. No vehicle shall display other than white lights to the front.

Section 23. It shall be unlawful to use sirens and automatic gongs on any vehicle except on fire and police vehicles, provided, however, that ambulances in emergency work may use a rotary gong.

Section 24. It shall be unlawful to stop or park any vehicle so as to obstruct any driveway.

Section 25. It shall be unlawful to drive or operate any vehicle within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, at any greater speed than twenty (20) miles per hour.

Section 26. The driver or person in charge of a vehicle is deemed the responsible person and in case of a violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is liable to the penalties imposed.

Section 27. Ordinance no. 132 and ordinance No. 167 are hereby repealed.

Section 28. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than \$200.00, or by imprisonment in the City or County jail for a period for a period not exceeding 60 days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 29. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary to preserve the health, peace and safety of the people of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, in this: that there is no adequate traffic ordinance in force in said town and that vehicles are being operated in a dangerous manner, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
