of Milwaukie does ordain as follows:

1. For the purpose of this ordinance a vehicle is hereby defined

It shall be unlawful to drive or operate motorcycles on the

ORDINANCE NO. 171.

Section 11. Emergency vehicles include fire and police vehicles... balances while on emergency calls and shall have the right of way... places over all other vehicles and street and interurban cars.

Section 12. It shall be unlawful to drive over fire hose or to operate any vehicles or street or interurban car while intoxicated in reckless or negligent manner.

Section 13. All vehicles shall be operated so as to allow a safe distance between the front of such vehicle and the rear end of any following vehicle. And the driver of any vehicle must comply with the direction or order to stop of any police or traffic officer.

Section 14. It shall be unlawful of any owner or person in charge in possession of any motor vehicle to permit any person under the age of sixteen years to drive or operate such motor vehicle unless a person is accompanied by his or her parent or guardian in the front seat of such motor vehicle.

Section 15. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive of private vehicle, street or interurban car through a funeral procession.

Section 16. Vehicles standing without a driver shall be secured so that it cannot be moved without human action and machinery must be attached. A machine shall not be locked so it cannot be moved. Every machine must have brakes in good condition.

Section 17. Drivers of all vehicles must report within 12 hours to a police person to the Marshal of all accidents to them or caused by them. Drivers of vehicles must have a clear and unobstructed view of the road from the front side and rear of vehicle.

Section 18. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or tread upon any vehicle without the consent of the driver.

Section 19. It shall be unlawful to operate any motor vehicle with offensive exhaust or with muffler open.

Section 20. Every motor vehicle, except a motorcycle or bicycle, during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, when in motion, shall display at least two white lights on the front and one red light on the rear of the vehicle. Rear lamp shall show a white light upon the state license number plate.

Section 21. Every motor vehicle during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, while stopped or parked upon a street shall display at least two white lights to the front and one red light on the rear, or display on the side nearest the center of the street, which it is parked or stopped a red or white light, which must be visible from the front and rear of such vehicle for a distance of not less than 100 feet in either direction.

Section 22. Motorcycles and bicycles shall display a white light on the front and a red light to the rear, such lights to be plainly visible from a distance of at least 200 feet; provided, however, motorcycles may use red reflex mirrors in lieu of a red light in rear. No vehicle shall display other than white lights to the front.

Section 23. It shall be unlawful to use sirens and automatic gongs on any vehicle except on fire and police vehicles, provided, however, an ambulance in emergency work may use a rotary gong.

Section 24. It shall be unlawful to stop or park any vehicle so as to obstruct any driveway.

Section 25. It shall be unlawful to drive or operate any vehicle in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, at any greater speed than twenty miles per hour.

Section 26. The driver or person in charge of a vehicle is deemed responsible person and in case of a violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is liable to the penalties imposed.

Section 27. Ordinance no. 132 and ordinance No. 167 are hereby repealed.

Section 28. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to the penalties imposed.
