

An ordinance to provide for the vacation of certain portions of Knox and Adams Streets, and Public Square, and certain alleys in the Town of Milwaukie as filed by Lot Whitcomb.

The Town of Milwaukie does ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the following streets, public square and alleys, the same are hereby vacated, to-wit:

^{334 ft} Broadway Street from the north line of Madison Street to the south line of Washington Street; ^{345 ft} Knox Street from the north line of Madison Street to the south line of Adams Street;

Adams Street from the west intersection of the property herein described, and which lies south of Washington Street extended;

The alleys in blocks 44 and 43.

All references to streets, public square and alleys mentioned in this ordinance are to the plat filed in the office of the Recorder of Deeds of Clackamas County, Oregon, on June 21, 1865, and which is known as the Lot Whitcomb Plat of Milwaukie, found on page 5 of plat Book 1, all of which streets, alleys and public square lie within the following described property, to-wit:

Shattuck and recorded in pages 409, 410 & 411, in the records of deeds of Clackamas Oregon, said corner being marked by a rock set in the middle county road and on division line between husband and wife of Claim No. 38, thence south on said division line seven (7) chains; north 80 degrees West eighty (8) and fifteen hundredths (15/100) thence north 10 degrees West six & 90/100 (6.90) ninety hundredths; thence North 80 degrees East along County Road nine (9.32) hundredths chains to place of beginning, containing 6 acres.
