

ORDINANCE NUMBER 306.

An ordinance prohibiting the dragging of logs, poles or piling or other thing upon or over the surface of the streets and public highways within the Town of Milwaukie, or the moving of logs and piling thereon without written permission, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance.

MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to drag logs, poles or piling or other thing upon or over the surface of any street, alley, avenue or public highway within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, without the written permission of the Council of Milwaukie.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to move logs or piling on or upon any of the streets, alleys, avenues or public highways within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, without the written permission of the Council of Milwaukie to do so.

Section 3. The Council of Milwaukie may, in its discretion, and upon written application give written permission to any person, firm or corporation to drag logs, poles or piling or other thing upon or over the surface of the streets, alleys, avenues or public highways in Milwaukie, Oregon, or to move logs or piling on or upon said streets, alleys, avenues and highways; provided, however, the Council shall require the applicant to give a satisfactory surety bond in such sum as it may deem proper, conditioned on the payment to said Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, any and all damages of every kind, nature and description caused to said streets, alleys, avenues and public highways by reason of the use thereof for the purposes hereinbefore specified.

Section 4. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon the conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), or by imprisonment for a period of not exceeding sixty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
