

ORDINANCE NO. 337

. 334

Ordinance providing for a special election to be held on the 2nd day of January, 1934, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of the Town of Milwaukie for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to amend the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts passed by said act by adding thereto Section 22-A authorizing the issue and sale of Five thousand Dollars (\$5,000) general obligation bonds of said Town to provide funds with which to purchase materials, to provide insurance and to supply engineering and other services in connection with Civic Works Projects of the government of the United States of America within the Town of Milwaukie, and for the levy of a special tax to pay principal of and interest on said bonds; and declaring an emergency.
