ORDINANCE NO. 351.

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Ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 140 by
ing for reduction of rates on water used in excess of the
during July, August, September and October of each year,
Ordinance numbered 305, and all other ordinances and
ordinances in conflict herewith.

Does Ordain As Follows:

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Section 1. That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 140 be, and the same
by, amended to read as follows:

Section 2. That on and after the first day of July, 1935, the

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following rates shall be charged to each customer and/ or user
the Milwaukie Water Department:

A. Minimum charge for water per connection with city water
to each user and/or customer located within the city
boundaries.....\$2.50 per 2 months period.

B. Minimum charge for water per connection with city water
to each user and/or customer located without the city
boundaries.....\$3.50 per 2 months period.

C. Each user and/or customer shall be allowed 800 cubic
feet of water for the minimum rate for each 2 months period.

D. For all quantities of water used and/or metered to the
particular premises of the user and/or customer in excess of
cubic feet the rate charge shall be as follows:

(1) Twenty (20) cents per hundred cubic feet to each user
and/or customer located within the city boundaries, provided,
however, that during the months of July-August, September-

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October of each year such rate shall be fifteen (15) cents per hundred hundred cubic feet.

(2) Thirty (30) cents per hundred cubic feet to user and/or customer located without the city boundaries provided, however, that during the months of July-August-September-October of each year such rate shall be twenty five (25) cents per hundred cubic feet.

For the purposes of this ordinance the location of the premises supplied shall determine the location of the user and/or customer. The Council may in its discretion make different rates for water supplied to public institutions and/or organizations."

Section 2. That Ordinance No. 305, entitled "An Ordinance amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 140", and all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
