ORDINANCE NO. 356

ORDINANCE relating to the hawking and peddling of popcorn,
candy, soda pop, peanuts, and similar wares, and providing
penalty for the violation thereof.

Article Does Ordain As Follows:

Section 1. No one shall hawk or peddle popcorn, icecream, soda
candy, peanuts, or similar wares in any street, or other place,
within two hundred feet of any public auditorium, or on any library
ground, or on any public park or ground, or any public grounds
where football, baseball, or any athletic games are
played, or within four hundred feet of any public or private
parking grounds, provided, however, that whenever in the judgment
of the City Marshal it is or will be congested in or around any
such place, it will be the duty of said Marshal to have and use
his authority to cause any vender of the above mentioned wares to move
and remain out of any congested area or district during the
course of any of the aforesaid events in any of the aforesaid
places.

Section 2. Any person convicted of violating any of the provisions
of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not exceeding Fifty
dollars (\$50.00), and to imprisonment for a period not exceeding
thirty (30) days, or to both such fine and imprisonment.
