

AN ORDINANCE providing for a special election to be held on the 3d of November, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukee for their acceptance or rejection a proposal to repeal Section 85 of the Charter of Milwaukee, known as the Well Water Amendment, providing further a designation of the polling places, judges, and of election, and declaring an emergency.

MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a special election be held on the 3d day of November, 1936, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukee for their acceptance or rejection the following proposal:-

AN ACT

To repeal Section 85 of the Charter of Milwaukee, known as the Well Water Amendment.

Section 1. That Section 85 of the Charter of Milwaukee, known as the Well Water Amendment, which reads as follows "Section 85. Council of Milwaukee is hereby authorized to acquire, construct, purchase, own, maintain, manage and operate municipal wells as a part of the municipal water supply of Milwaukee and vicinity, and sell any surplus of such well water over and above the needs and requirements of the people of Milwaukee." be, and the same is hereby repealed. This proposal was presented by initiative petitions duly and regularly filed with the Recorder on the 5th day of October, 1936.

Section 2. The following named places are hereby designated as polling places for the special election to be held on the 3d day of November, 1936:
