ORDINANCE NO. 411

AN ORDINANCE providing for a special election to be held on the 5th day of May, 1941, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie, for their acceptance or rejection, two proposals to amend the Charter of Milwaukie, filed in the office of the Secretary of State, February 11, 1905, and to amend all acts amending said Act by providing, as the first proposal, that the Council of Milwaukie may enter into an agreement with the Clackamas County Housing Authority relative to the establishment of a United States Housing Authority project within the corporate limits of Milwaukie; by providing, as the second proposal, that the Council may expend up to \$100.00 in conducting the election provided for herein, and providing further, a designation of the polling places, judges and clerks of election, and declaring an emergency.

MILWAUKIE Does Ordain As Follows:

Section 1. That a special election be held on the 5th day of May, 1941, for the purpose of submitting to the voters of Milwaukie, for their acceptance or rejection, the following proposals:

AN ACT

To amend an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Town of Milwaukie in Clackamas County, Oregon, and to repeal all acts and parts of acts in conflict therewith, to-wit: 'An Act to incorporate the Town of Milwaukie in Clackamas County, Oregon' passed by the 22nd regular session of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon and approved by the Governor on February 4, 1903, passed by the 23rd session of the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, and filed in the office of the Secretary of State February 11, 1905, as amended by all amendments to said Act adopted by the Legislative Assembly or by vote of the people by adding thereto Sections 87 and 88 to read as follows:

Section 87. The Council of Milwaukie is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the Clackamas County Housing Authority relative to the establishment of a United States Housing Authority project within the corporate limits of Milwaukie.

Section 88. The Council of Milwaukie is hereby authorized to expend not to exceed \$100.00 in conducting that certain election to be held on the 5th day of May, 1941, relating to the question of the construction of a United States Housing Authority project in Milwaukie.

Section 2. The following named places are hereby designated as the polling places for said election, and the following named are hereby designated and appointed as and for judges and clerks of election, to act at said polling places for said election, and said date, to-wit:

WARD NO. 1. Polling place, City Hall, 926 Main Street,
Milwaukie, Oregon:

Election Board

Sadie Lewellyn, Chairman
Harry Dean and A. J. Gauger, Judges
Evelyn Hoesly and Elva Jones, Clerks.

WARD NO. 2. Polling place, Fire Hall in East Milwaukie on
Railroad Avenue:

Ralph Geil, Chairman
Ora Mazzei and Minerva Jones, Judges
H. G. Coates and Olive Cates, Clerks.

Section 3. Since the question of whether or not a United States Housing Authority Project should be placed in Milwaukie is one of imminent concern to the voters and people of Milwaukie, and since many voters and citizens have requested that the matter be put up for decision of the voters as soon as possible, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall become effective upon its passage by the Council and signature by the Mayor.
