

ORDINANCE NO. 421

An ordinance providing that the City Marshal may cause vehicles left on the city streets or roadways for more than <sup>36</sup>~~72~~ consecutive hours to be placed in storage and providing for the collection of the removal to storage and the storage charges.

MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. If the City Marshal shall find that a vehicle has been left upon a city street or roadway for more than ~~seventy-two~~<sup>thirty-six</sup> consecutive hours, he may cause the same to be removed to a for-hire garage for storage. In the event, the Marshal shall place a vehicle in a for-hire garage for storage, he shall not deliver the vehicle to any person unless such person produce legal evidence that he is the owner thereof and also pay the accrued removal and storage charges.

If no person shall redeem the vehicle, as herein provided, within thirty days after the same is so stored, the Marshal may, after giving two weeks notice thereof in a newspaper of general circulation in the community, sell the same at public auction to the highest cash bidder, at a time and place specified in said published notice, and shall apply the proceeds of such sale first to the payment of the accrued removal and storage charges and shall pay over to the City Treasurer any balance in excess of such charges.
