

ORDINANCE NO. 519

AN ORDINANCE LICENSING, TAXING AND REGULATING PUBLIC POOL AND BILLIAR ROOMS: PROHIBITING GAMBLIN THEREIN: PROHIBITING MINORS FROM BEING OR REMAINING IN OR ABOUT SUCH ROOMS: PROVIDING FOR A TIME OF CLOSING: PROVIDING A MANNER OF DETERMINING THE SUITABILITY OF THE LOCATION THEREOF: PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE: AND REPEALING ORDINANCES NUMBERED 51 and 173: AND ALL OTHER ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

The City of Milwaukie does ordain as follows;-

Section 1. For the purpose of this ordinance every place where pool or billiards are played and there is a charge made, either directly or indirectly, for the privilege of playing such games, shall be regared as a public pool or billiard room.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to engage in the business or occupation of conducting a public pool or billiard room within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, where games of pool or billiards are played, without first obtaining a license therefor. Every person, firm or corporation desiring to operate a public pool or billiard room in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon shall make application to the City Recorder for a license to conduct such business; and shall at the time of making such application pay to the City Recorder a license fee of \$10.00 per quarter for the first table and \$2.50 per quarter for each additional table to be used; such fee to be paid on the 1st day of January, April, July and October of each year; when such application is made it shall be refered to the City Manager, Chief of Police and Fire Chief, who shall examine the premises where such public pool ~~room~~ or billiard room is sought to be established; and they shall report to the City recorder in writing the sutiability of the premises for such business; if they submit a unanimous report of favor of granting such license, the City Recorder shall grant such licenses; if they submit a unanimous report against the granting of such license, such application shall be rejected by the City Recorder; if a divided report is submitted the City Recorder shall refer the matter to the City Council, which may on motion grant or reject such application; or it may grant such license, subject to such restriction as it may impose.

Section 3. Every public pool or billiard room in the City of Milwaukie shall be closed between the hours of 1.00 A.M. and 8 1/2 A.M of each week day and shall be closed on Sundays from 1;00 A.M. to 2 P.M.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, keeper, owner or person or persons in charge of any public pool or billiard room within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon to permit or allow any game played with cards, dice, pool or billiards to be played for money, checks, credits, merchandise or any other representation of value, within such public pool or billiard room..

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any proprietor, keeper, owner or person in cahрге of any public pool or billiard room within the City of Milwaukie to permit, suffer or allow any minor to go into, visit, to be or to remain in any such public pool or billiard room.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any minor to go into, visit or to be or remain in or about any public pool or billiard room within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Section 7. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not to exceed \$300.00 or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a perior of not to exceed 30 days or by both such fine and imprisonment; and is such violation shall be on the part of any proprietor or employee of such licensee his license shall be immediately revoked.

Section 8. Ordinance No. 51 and 173 and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflicy herewith are hereby repealed.
