

ORDINANCE NO. 543

AND ORDINANCE DECLARING THE ASSESSMENT FOR RECONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND RELAYING OF CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG BOTH SIDES OF WASHINGTON, ELMER, OAK, RAILROAD AND MONROE STREETS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1. That the assessment for the construction of curbs and sidewalks along both sides ~~of~~ the hereinafter described parts of streets where none now exist; and repair of curbs and sidewalks along the same where they now exist but do not conform to standards established by the City of Milwaukie, as to grade alignment or quality;

Beginning at the intersection of Washington Street with the easterly line of **Front** Street; running thence easterly along both side of Washington Street to its intersection with Elmer Street; thence southeasterly along both sides of Elmer Street to its intersection with the westerly lines of 32nd Street and Oak Streets; thence northeasterly along both sides of Oak Street to its intersection with the southwesterly line of Railroad Avenue; thence southeasterly along both sides of Railroad Avenue to its intersection with Monroe Street; thence along both sides of Monroe Street to its intersection with the westerly line of 42nd Street;

is hereby declared to be levied according to Assessment Roll No. 52 now on file with the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Section 2.

That the whole cost of such improvement is hereby declared to be \$ 4,212.84.


Section 3. Inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the City of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof in this; It is necessary that the assessment to pay the cost of such improvement be declared and levied in order to secure funds to pay the cost thereof and maintain the public credit. Therefore an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
