

An Ordinance vacating a Part of the North Side of Washington Street ^{and} between the East Line of Main Street and the West Line of Irving Street.

The Town of Milwaukie does hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. That a part of the North side of Washington Street between the East line of Main Street and the West Line of Irving Street in the town of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, being a certain strip of ground situate and adjacent to Block Number Thirty, as shown upon the recorded plat of said town of Milwaukie in county and state aforesaid and more particularly described as follows: Beginning at a point, the center of the intersection of Main and Washington Streets, and point being marked by a monument determining the boundaries of Main Street in connection with a like monument in the center of the intersection of Main and Jefferson Street as shown of the town plat, thence thirty five feet in a northerly direction to a point, thence forth feet in an Easterly direction parallel with Washington Street to the point of beginning of the tract herein to be vacated, thence in an Easterly direction parallel with Washington Street Two Hundred Ten (210) feet to a point; thence in a Southerly direction, parallel with Main Street Ten (10) feet to a point; thence in a Westerly direction, parallel with Washington Street, Two Hundred Ten (210) feet to a point; thence in a northerly direction parallel with Main Street Ten (10) feet to the point of beginning, containing two fifths ($2/5$) of a lot more or less, be and the same is hereby vacated and the dedication of said part of Washington Street for use as a public street and highway be and the same is hereby set aside and vacated as though same had never been made.
