

ORDINANCE NO 579

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING A LICENSE FROM ALL PERSONS ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF REVEALING OR ATTEMPTING TO REVEAL THE FUTURE EVENTS IN ANOTHER'S LIFE: SETTING UP STANDARDS FOR QUALIFYING FOR SUCH LICENSE: REQUIRING A BOND FROM ALL PERSONS SO ENGAGED AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION HEREOF.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1. No person shall engage in the business of revealing or attempting to reveal the future events in another's life, within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, without first obtaining from the City of Milwaukie, a licensr therefor, as hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. Any person desiring to engage in such business within the City of Milwaulie, shall first make application to the City Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, in writing and such application shall contain the following information.

A. The name and present residence of the applicant.

B. The residences of such applicant for a period of not less than 10 years, prior to the execution of such application.

C. The statement that he has never been convicted of any crime, or in lieu thereof a description of crimes of which he has been convicted; such description shall contain a statement of the nature of such a crime, the time and place where such conviction was had and the title of the court before which such conviction was obtained.

D. The recommendation of not less than two freeholders, together with their assurance that the applicant has a good moral character.

C. The street address at which such business will be conducted and at the time of making such application such person shall pay to the City Recorder the sum of \$25.00, which sum shall pay the license fee for the then calander year.

Section 3. Such application shall be presented by the Recorder to the Council of the City of Milwaukie, which shall grant such license, if it determins that such applicant is a proper person to conduct such a business; but such approval shall be subject to the condition that such applicant deposit with the City Recorder a bond in acceptable form and with either a corporate surety or two qualified individuals, and in the principal sum of \$5,000.00, wherein it is agreed to indemnify any person who suffers loss by reason of any dealings with the applicant in his business capacity.

Section 4. Each such license so granted shall terminate on the 31st day of December of the year granted and thereafter be renewable on the same terms as granted initially.

Section 5. Any person who engages in such business without first securing the license required by this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdomeanor, and upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than \$500.00 or imprisoned for not more than 30 days or may be punished by both fine and imprisonment.
