

ORDINANCE NO. 584

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 37TH STREET BETWEEN ITS INTERSECTION WITH KING STREET AND ITS INTERSECTION WITH HARRISON STREET BY THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG BOTH SIDES THEREOF, WHERE NONE NOW EXISTS AND WHERE THEY DO EXIST BUT DO NOT CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS AS TO ALIGNMENT, GRADE OR QUALITY; ~~AND~~ DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDIN AS FOLLOWS;-

Section 1. That 37th Street from its interscetion with King Street to its intersection with ~~Harrison Street~~ be improve by the construction of curbs and sidewalks along both sides thereof, wherd none now exists, or where such as do exist do not conform to City Standards as to alignment, grade or quality, between to following termini.

Beginning at the intersection of said 37th Street with the southerly line of King Street; thence southerly along said 37th Street to its intersection with the northerly line of Harrison Street.

Section 2. Said improvement shall substantially conform to the plans and specifications therefore now on file with the City Recorder, which plans and specifications hereby are refered to and by this reference made a part of this ordinance; and which said plans and specifications were adopted by Resolution No. 8-1953 by the Council of the City of Milwaukie on the 11th day of May, 1953.

Section 3. That on the taking effect of this Ordinance, the City Manager, without delay, shall give notice inviting proposals for the construction of said improvement, by publication of notice thereof in the Daily Journal of Commerce at least one time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as said improvement is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, therefore an emergency hereby is declared to exist and this Ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
