

ORDINANCE NUMBER 600

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 29th STREET, BY THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS AND SIDEWALKS ALONG BOTH SIDES THEREOF, WHERE NONE NOW EXIST, AND WHERE THEY DO EXIST BUT DO NOT CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS AS TO GRADE, ALIGNMENT OR QUALITY, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH HARRISON STREET SOUTHERLY TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH WASHINGTON STREET: AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That 29th Street from its intersection with Harrison Street southerly to its intersection with Washington Street, be improved by construction of curbs and sidewalks, where none now exist or where such as do exist do not conform to City standards as to alignment, grade or quality, along both sides thereof; and between the following termini:-

Beginning at the intersection of the southerly line of Harrison Street with said 29th Street; thence southerly along said 29th Street to the northerly line of Washington Street.

Section 2. Said improvement shall substantially conform to the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which said plans and specifications hereby are referred to and by this reference made a part of this ordinance; which said plans and specifications were adopted by Resolution No. 8-1954 by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, on the 24th day of May, 1954

Section 3. That on the taking effect of this ordinance, the City Manager, without delay, shall give notice inviting proposals for the construction of said improvement, by publishing notice thereof in the Daily Journal of Commerce at least one time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as said improvement is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health and safety; therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
