

ORDINANCE NO. 609

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 30TH STREET BY THE ~~THE~~ CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS, SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS ALONG BOTH SIDES THEREOF, WHERE NONE NOW EXIST AND WHERE THEY DO EXIST BUT DO NOT CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS AS TO GRADE, ALIGNMENT OR QUALITY; ~~FROM ITS~~ INTERSECTION WITH WASHINGTON STREET, SOUTHERLY TO ITS SOUTHERN TERMINUS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That 30th Street from its intersection with Washington Street, southerly to its southerly terminus, be improved by the construction of curbs, sidewalks and driveways along both sides thereof, where none now exists or where such as do exist do not conform to city standards as to alignment, grade or quality, between the following termini.

Beginning at the intersection of the southerly line of Washington Street; thence southerly along said 30th street to its southerly terminus.

Section 2. Said improvement shall substantially conform to the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which said plans and specifications are hereby referred to and by this reference made a part of this ordinance; and which said plans and specifications were adopted by Resolution No. 15, 1954 by the Council of the City of Milwaukie on the 27th day of December, 1954.

Section 3. That on the taking effect of this ordinance, the City Manager, without delay, shall give notice inviting proposals for the construction of said improvement, by publishing notice thereof in the Daily Journal of Commerce, at least one time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as said improvement is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall go into full force and effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

Read the first time this 14th day of February, 1955.

Read the second time and passed the 28<sup>th</sup> day of February, 1955
