

ORDINANCE NUMBER 620

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE ASSESSMENT FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 30th STREET BY THE CONSTRUCTION OF CURBS, SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAYS ALONG BOTH SIDES THEREOF, WHERE NONE EXISTED AND WHERE THEY DID EXIST BUT DID NOT CONFORM TO CITY STANDARDS AS TO GRADE, ALIGNMENT OR QUALITY, FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH WASHINGTON STREET SOUTHERLY TO ITS SOUTHERLY TERMINUS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the assessment for the improvement of 30th Street, by construction of curbs, sidewalks and driveways along both sides thereof, where none existed and where they did exist but did not conform to city standards as to grade, alignment or quality from its intersection with Washington Street southerly to its southerly terminus, is hereby declared and levied according the ASSESSMENT ROLL NUMBER SIXTY-SIX (66), now on file with the Recorder of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Section 2. That the entire cost of the improvement of said Street is hereby declared to be \$ 8501.77

Section 3. In as much as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof, in this, that it is necessary that the assessment to pay the cost of the improvement of said street be declared and levied in order to secure funds to pay the cost thereof and to maintain public credit; therefore an emergency is declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
