

ORDINANCE NUMBER 643

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SANITARY SEWER ALONG MAIN STREET A DISTANCE OF 1354 FEET SOUTHERLY FROM THE SEWER PRESENTLY IN THE CENTER LINE OF HARVESTER DRIVE AT ITS INTERSECTION WITH MAIN STREET, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That a sanitary sewer, together with all catch basins, inlets and all things necessary in the construction thereof, shall be constructed from a point beginning at Station 351+50 which point is the intersection of the center line of Harvester Drive and Main Street Milwaukie, Oregon, thence South along the center line of Main Street as surveyed and stationoned by State Highway Engineers to Station 338+00 which is the southerly terminus of said proposed sanitary sewer. Said sewer to be constructed in accordance with the plans and specifications for said sewer heretofore filed with the Recorder and adopted by resolution of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon on the 14th day of May, 1956.

Section 2. In as much as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof, in this, that it is urgently required for the purpose of maintaining public credit and the alleviation of sewage and drainage conditions which presently tend to impair the health and welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Milwaukie and adjacent territory, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage by the City Council and its signing by the Mayor.
