

ORDINANCE NUMBER 645

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A SANITARY SEWER ALONG JEFFERSON STREET FROM THE EXISTING SEWER IN JEFFERSON STREET TO THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY OF KEIL HEIGHTS, DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO GIVE NOTICE INVITING PROPOSALS THEREFOR BY PUBLICATION OF SUCH NOTICE IN THE DAILY JOURNAL OF COMMERCE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1:- That a Sanitary sewer, together with all necessary things in the construction thereof, shall be constructed in Jefferson Street from the present existing sewer in Jefferson Street easterly to the east boundary of Keil Heights.

Section 2:- That the construction of said sanitary sewer shall substantially conform to the plans and specifications therefor which have heretofore been filed with the City Recorder; which plans and specifications hereby are referred to and by this reference, made a part of this ordinance, said plans and specifications were adopted by a Resolution of the City Council on the 11th day of June 1956 in Resolution Number 7-1956.

Section 3:- That upon the taking effect of this Ordinance the City Manager shall give notice inviting proposals for the construction of said sanitary sewer by publishing notice thereof in the Daily Journal of Commerce at least one time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety of the City of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof, in this, that it is urgently required for the purpose of maintaining public credit and the alleviation of sewage and drainage conditions which presently tend to impair the health and welfare of inhabitants of the City of Milwaukie and adjacent territory, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage by the City Council and its signing by the Mayor.

Read the second time and passed by the Council this 9<sup>th</sup> day of July 1956
