

ORDINANCE NUMBER 646

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWERS ALONG ADAMS STREET, FROM 42nd STREET TO THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY OF KEIL HEIGHTS; RIO VISTA STREET FROM S.S.FIELDS ROAD, ALSO KNOWN AS RAILROAD AVENUE, TO THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY OF KEIL HEIGHTS; FRANKLIN STREET FROM S.S. FIELDS ROAD TO THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY OF KEIL HEIGHTS; ~~FRANKLIN STREET FROM S.S. FIELDS ROAD TO THE EASTERLY BOUNDARY OF KEIL HEIGHTS;~~ S.S.FIELDS ROAD, FROM RIO VISTA, TO WALSH ROAD, ALSO KNOWN AS 46th STREET; 46th STREET FROM S.S.FIELDS ROAD NORTHERLY A DISTANCE OF 1100 FEET; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That Sanitary sewers, together with all things necessary in the construction thereof, shall be constructed in the following Streets:

Adams Street, from 42nd Street to the easterly boundary of Keil Heights

Rio Vista Street, from S.S.Fields Road, also Known as Railroad Avenue, to the easterly boundary of Keil Heights

Franklin Street, from S.S.Fields Road, also known as Railroad Avenue, to the easterly boundary of Keil Heights.

S.S.Fields Road, also known as Railroad Avenue, from Rio Vista Street to Walsh Road, also known as 46th Street.

Walsh Road, also known as 46th Street from S.S.Fields, also known as Railroad Avenue, north a distance of 1100 feet.

Section 2. That the construction of said sanitary sewers shall substantially conform to the plans and specifications therefor, which have heretofore been filed with the City Recorder, which plans and specifications hereby are referred to and by this reference, made a part of this ordinance, said plans and specifications having been adopted by Resolution Number 8-1956, of the City Council on the 11th day of June, 1956.

Section 3. That upon the taking effect of this ordinance the City Manager shall give notice inviting proposals for the construction of said sanitary sewers, by publishing notice thereof in the Daily Journal of Commerce at least one time.

Section 4. Inasmuch as this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety of the City of Milwaukie and the inhabitants thereof, in this, that it is urgently required for the purpose of maintaining public cewdit and the alleviation of sewage and drainage conditions which presently tend to impair the health and welfare of inhabitants of the City of Milwaukie and adjacent territory, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect from and after its passage by the Council and its signing by the Mayor.
