

ORDINANCE NO.70.

AN ORDINANCE granting to the Oregon and California Railroad Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, the right and privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate electric transmission lines, telephone lines and telegraph lines, and the right and privilege to erect poles and stretch wires thereon and thereover, over and upon the right of way and property of the Beaverton & Willsburg Railroad Company, and across the streets intersecting said right of way, as the same is now located through said Town of Milwaukie.

THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Oregon and California Railroad Company, a corporation duly organized, incorporated and existing under the laws of the State of Oregon, having its principal office and place of business in the City of Portland in said state, and its successors, lessees and assigns, are hereby granted the right and privilege to erect, construct, maintain and operate electric transmission lines, telephone lines and telegraph lines, and the right and privilege to erect poles and stretch wires thereon and thereover, through, over and upon the right of way and property of the Beaverton & Willsburg Railroad Company as the same is now located within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie, and across the intersecting streets, alleys and public highways of the Town of Milwaukie.

Section 2. The right and privileges granted by this ordinance are granted upon the condition that said grantee shall, within thirty days after the enactment of this ordinance, file in the office of the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie its written acceptance of this ordinance.
