AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A CITY ELECTION IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, ON THE 16th DAY OF MAY, 1958, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY COUNCIL OF SAID CITY TO INCLUDE IN THE BUDGET AND LEVY THE SUM OF \$14,085.00 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1958-1959 FOR GENERAL CITY PURPOSES, WHICH AMOUNT EXCEEDS THE CONSTITUTIONAL SIX PER CENT LIMITATION ON TAXATION SET FORTH IN SECTION 11, ARTICLE XI, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF OREGON, AND WHICH AMOUNT IS IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER TAXES LEVIED.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has considered the receipts and expenditures of the said City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1958, and ending June 30, 1959, and the report of the Budget Committee, and is of the opinion that in order to adequately pay the expenses necessary for general city purposes for such fiscal year, it will be necessary to levy a tax outside of the six per cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, in the amount of \$14,085.00 to pay the operating expenses of such City for such fiscal year.

Section 2. The proposition set forth in Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in this Ordinance to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at an election to be held at the time and place hereinafter prescribed.

Section 3. At the said election there shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection, the following proposition:

"Shall the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, be authorized and directed to include in the budget and levy a tax on all the taxable property in said city in the sum of \$14,085.00, for the fiscal year 1958-1959, for general city purposes, which sum exceeds the six per cent limitation on taxation as set forth in Section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon, which shall be in addition to all other taxes levied?"

Section 4. There is a state-wide regular primary election being held in the State of Oregon and in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on May 16, 1958, and this city election is called to be held concurrently therewith and as a part thereof.

Section 5. (1) The regular polling places designated by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, in the voting precincts in the City of Milwaukie hereby are designated as the polling places for the city election; the poll books adopted by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, as the poll books for the state-wide regular primary election for the voting precincts in the City of Milwaukie hereby are adopted as the poll books for the said City election; and the judges and clerks of election appointed by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, to serve at the state-wide regular primary election hereby are designated as the judges and clerks of and for the said city election.

(2) The judges and clerks shall hold their respective offices as designated for the state-wide regular primary election.

(3) The polls for the city tax base election shall be opened in each of the voting precincts at the same hour, and shall be kept open until the same hour, as the polls are opened and closed for the state-wide regular primary election that will be held on the same day.

Section 6. The Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of said election by posting a notice thereof in three public places within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for a period of at least ten days prior to the date of said election, and by publishing a notice of said election once in the Milwaukie Review, the official city newspaper, at least ten days prior to said election. Said notice shall contain the time and place of the election, and the measure voted upon.

Section 7. Inasmuch as this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the inhabitants thereof, in this, that it is urgently and immediately required that additional tax revenues be provided for to meet the increased cost of government and

to maintain the public credit, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its passage and signing by the Mayor.
