It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Mortensen that Earl Clay be appointed to serve as Mayor for the unexpired term of Leonard Mullan. The motion was carried by the unanimous vote of the Council and was so ordered.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF MAY 22, 1959

A Special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-second day of May, 1959, for the purpose of a hearing on the question of the vacation of a portion of Chemeteka Street and such other business as was necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick and Howard; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Clerk Martin.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the vacation of a portion of Chemeteka Street. It was shown that proper public notice had been given for this vacation. The Mayor called for any objection to the vacation. There was no citizen present who made objection to the vacation. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that an ordinance be drawn, providing for the vacation of the southerly five feet of Chemeteka Street, from its intersection with 35th Street easterly to the westerly boundary of Minthorn Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

Petitions, requesting that an election be held, in the territory, to annex to the City, certain territory contiguous to the City, said territory being in the Wills D.L.C., Derry Acres, Garner Acres and Masonmead, were laid before the Council. It was moved by Clay and seconded by Mortensen that the proper procedure be taken to annex these territories by election in the territory, and that a hearing be held on this question on June 15, 1959. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 744 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance No. 744 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 744, AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex certain territory, contiguous to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, dispensing with the submission of the question of such annexation to the registered voters of the City, fixing a day for public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at which time the registered voters of the City may appear and be heard on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Mortensen, Sedgwick

and Howard. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 744 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

## SPECIAL MEETING OF MAY 25, 1959 (Continued)

A special meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-fifth day of May, 1959, at 8:00 o'clock P.M., for the purpose of conducting the public hearing on the City's 1959-1960 budget estimates, and such other business necessary to come before the Council at this time.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Mortensen and Howard, and Attorney Sheldahl. Absent: Councilman Sedgwick, Manager Burdick and Clerk Martin.

At the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., the Mayor publicly announced that this was the time and place fixed for the public hearing on the budget estimates as the same had been adopted by the duly appointed Budget Committee of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1959 to June 30, 1960.

The Mayor then called out that any person subject to the proposed tax levy or levies would be heard in favor of or against the said proposals.

No such person appearing or presenting himself, the Council proceeded with a discussion of other business.

At the hour of 8:30 PM., no person subject to the proposed tax levy or tax levies having appeared to be heard in favor of or against them, the Mayor declared that the public hearing on the budget estimates for the said fiscal year be closed.

It was then moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Mortensen that the budget estimates as prepared by the duly constituted Budget Committee of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1959 to June 30, 1960 as set forth in said budget estimates be adopted as the budget of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1959 to June 30, 1960.

Upon being put to vote by the Mayor, the motion carried un-animously.

It was then moved by Councilman Clay and seconded by Councilman Howard that an Ordinance providing the tax levy on all taxable property within the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, for city purposes for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1959 and ending June 30, 1960, with an emergency clause, be prepared by the City Attorney.

Upon being put to vote by the Mayor, the motion carried un-animously.

Ordinance Number 745 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Clay that Ordinance No. 745 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried, the meeting adjourned.
