

MEETING OF OCTOBER 12, 1959

939th MEETING

The nine hundred thirty-ninth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukee was held on the twelfth day of October, 1959.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Earl Clay.

Present: Mayor Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Peter Mortensen, Ernest Aebi and Theron Sedgwick; Manager Leonard Mullan, Attorney John Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred thirty-eight regular meeting of the Council, held on the fourteenth day of September, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of an adjourned meeting of the regular meeting, held on the eighteenth day of September, 1959, were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of September, 1959, were approved as written.

A group of citizens, living in the neighborhood of 37th and Harrison Streets, laid before the Council, a petition, signed by twenty-one of the petitioners, requesting that a traffic sign, stopping west bound traffic on Harrison Street, before entering 37th Street. It was moved by Mortensen and signed by Aebi that the petition be referred to the Traffic Committee. Motion carried and so ordered.

John J. and Barbara Mildenerger, owners of Lot 8, Block 9, J.R.W. Sellwood's Addition, laid before the Council a petition requesting the vacation of that part of Olive Street which lies southeasterly of said Lot 8. After viewing the map the Council were reluctant to take action on this matter at this time.

Mr. Mildenerger reported that trucks had been dumping concrete and dirt on this section of Olive Street and that some of the material dumped had overlapped the street line and onto their property, making it unusable as a garden plot. The Council requested Manager Mullan to make investigation of this condition.

Manager Mullan laid before the Council, a deed, signed by Eda Zolezzo, for a strip of land, from King Street to the south boundary of Boly Addition and along the west side of 36th Street, to be used for street purposes in widening 36th Street at this place. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Sedgwick that the Council accept the deed. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Clerk announced that this was the time set for the hearing on the annexation of contiguous properties and on the question of the vacation of a portion of Olive Street.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of Lots 14 to 18, Block 1, Fieldcrest Addition and Lots 19 to 16 and the west 5 feet of Lot 15, Block 88, Minthorn Addition and called for objections to the same. There was no person present who objected to this annexation. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the question of the vacation of a portion of Olive Street in the J.R.W. Sellwood's Addition, and called for any objections to the same. There was no person present who made objection to this vacation, and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance No. 762 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance No. 762 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance No. 762 AN ORDINANCE defining "Vehicle", prohibiting drivers of vehicles and others as therein defined from making a left turn from River Road to cross U. S. Highway 99E into Scott Street, in the City of Milwaukee, Oregon; providing penalties for the violation thereof, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 762 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.
