

MEETING OF OCTOBER 12, 1959 (Continued)

Ordinance Number 763 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance No. 763 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 763, AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territories contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 763 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 764 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance Number 764 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 764 AN ORDINANCE vacating a portion of Olive Street, a public street within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 764 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A delegation of owners of property along the shores of Kellogg Lake, came before the Council. Mr. Charles Gelinsky, acting as spokesman for the group, illustrated on a map, the object of their visit and voiced their request for a larger opening from Kellogg Lake in to the river. Mr. Gelinski explained that if the lake outlet were to be increased in size to 3 feet by 9½ feet instead of the 20 inch pipe now in use, the larger outlet could be opened during late winter and early spring, thus increasing the velocity of the flow of water, narrow the channel and thereby wash hundreds of yards of silt, now left in the lake, into the river. Mr. Gelinski explained that the lake was now in danger of being filled with this silt. There was some discussion on the matter in which the question arose as to whether the State Highway Department or the City had installed the 20 inch outlet now used. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Mortensen that if the Chairman of the Kellogg Lake Committee could show proof that the State Highway Department would have no objection to the larger opening for the lake, the City furnish \$250.00 from the Emergency Fund, toward the expense of having the larger opening installed. The Council passed the motion with one dissenting vote by Dr. Howard. The Mayor declared that the motion had been passed by the Council.

Ordinance Number 765 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Sedgwick and seconded by Mortensen that Ordinance No. 765 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 765 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories, contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 765 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

An application for a recommendation for a Class "A" (D.A.) Dispensers License was laid before the Council by Warren Hyde. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Sedgwick that the Council recommend that the Dispensers License be granted to Mr. Hyde. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mayor Clay reported that he had appointed Mr. Arthur Martineau to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Aebi on the Planning Commission and that he had appointed Mr. Max Thompson to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Howard Perkins.

Mayor Clay reported that Mr. Howard Perkins had resigned from the Planning Commission on account of his business obligations taking him from the City so much of the time.

It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that the Council approve
