Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance No. 772 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

MEETING OF DECEMBER 14, 1959

941st MEETING

The nine-hundred forty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the fourteenth day of December, 1959

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Clay.

Present: Mayor Clay; Councilmen James Howard, Peter Mortensen, E. H. Aebi and Theron Sedgwick; City Manager Leonard Mullan, Attorney John Sheldahl and Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred fortieth regular meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of November, 1959, were read and approved as read.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the thirtieth day of November, 1959, were read and approved as read.

Dr. Slominski came before the Council and made inquiry as to the progress of the vacation of the north end of an alley to the west of his property at 23rd and Washington Streets. There was discussion on the question and it was shown that at the time he built his clinic on his property, he had set the building westward leaving a wide setback from 23rd Street to provide for the future widening of 23rd Street. The question arose as to whether or not all of the alley had been given from Duerst's Addition or if Tscharner had given a part of his land at the time Duerst's Addition was platted. Dr. Slominski was advised to make a search of the records to get the facts.

The Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of territories as listed in Ordinance No. 767 and called for any remonstrances or objections. There was no citizen present who made objection and no written remonstrance had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed. Ordinance No. 773 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Sedgwick that Ordinance No. 773 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.
