Urban Renewal Plan Close to Final Consideration

An urban renewal plan public hearing is scheduled for Aug. 2, and the potential urban renewal plan will be voted on by City Council on Aug. 2 or Aug. 16. If adopted, the urban renewal plan would provide funding for projects in three main categories:

- Economic Development:** new places to live, work, eat and shop
- Transportation:** getting to and through downtown and central Milwaukie
- Public Amenities:** improvements to parks and public spaces, gateway and entryway improvements

The urban renewal plan is an implementation tool of the Moving Forward Milwaukie Plan, a two-year planning process that was completed in December 2015. Water Tower Improvements Begin in August



Starting in early August, the city's water department will repaint the elevated tank at Water Tower Park at the corner of SE 40th Avenue and Harvey Street. Exterior painting will be done first with crews anticipating to finish in late August to early September. The interior

of the tank will be painted starting in November. Surface preparation and painting will be performed in accordance with all applicable environmental safety and health standards.

Work hours are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday through Friday. During the project, the area around the tower will be closed and protected by a temporary fence. Recent Developments Keep Milwaukie Moving Forward

Have you seen the lovely streetscape improvements in downtown Canby, Estacada and Sandy in recent years? Or Millennium Park on the shore of Oswego Lake, now home to the Lake Oswego Farmers Market? What do these projects have in common? They were all funded, at least in part, by urban renewal funds.

Few terms are as misunderstood as "urban renewal." The more apt term is "tax increment financing," and it is a very common tool for financing public projects in Oregon, used in small towns as well as urban areas.

Urban renewal is one of the few funding tools that does not raise taxes or fees on homeowners.

Milwaukie is one of a very few cities in the metro area without an urban renewal plan. Check out examples at www.oregonurbanrenewal.org.

I'm thrilled that Milwaukie appears to be close to adopting the urban renewal plan that has been in the works since Council identified this as a goal in the spring of 2015. I chaired the advisory group that met over the past six months, and the Planning Commission recently recommended adoption of the Plan, which will come before Council on Aug. 2. 


Millennium Plaza Park, overlooking Lakewood Bay in Lake Oswego, was made possible through the city's urban renewal plan and just one example of the type of projects that can be funded. The park features a large pergola with an open fireplace, reflecting pond, concert and special event space, and public art.

Urban renewal isn't the only exciting development here in Milwaukie. Council recently voted unanimously to adopt the Bicycle and Pedestrian Accessibility Program, which is a plan for how the city will comply with Americans with Disability Act requirements, build Safe Routes to Schools, and generally enhance the infrastructure for pedestrians and bicyclists throughout our fair city. Kudos to Chair Angel Falconer and other members of the Public Safety Advisory Committee for all their hard work over the past year pulling this plan together.

August Artist Series: Theodore Holdt




Refuse to Look Into Your Eyes by Theodore Holdt.

For the first time, Sunday Parkways is coming to Milwaukie! On Sunday, Oct. 2 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., this annual event opens streets and public spaces to encourage people to walk, bike and roll through the community, interact with neighbors, visit local businesses, and connect with the city. This is the last event of five in this year's Sunday Parkways series. Sunday Parkways events are free and open to the entire community.

This new route includes Water Tower Park, the Milwaukie Farmers Market and Milwaukie Business District, as well as Westmoreland and Sellwood.

During the family-friendly event, city streets along the route are closed, which allow participants to easily and safely navigate through the community. Along the route, community partners, businesses, musicians and other entertainers set up, creating a festival-like atmosphere.

Sunday Parkways, presented by Kaiser Permanente, promotes healthy active living through a series of free events opening the some of the region's largest largest public spaces. The hope is when people discover just how much fun it is to walk, bike, skate or roll through the city, they'll want to incorporate more physical activity into their everyday lives. During last year's series of events, approximately 119,000 participants enjoyed Sunday Parkways.

An event of this size is only made possible by the generosity of volunteers. Volunteers are needed along the Milwaukie Sellwood route to help coordinate traffic at route intersections, provide mechanical support for participants' bicycles, patrol the

BIKE SAFETY

Bike riding during the summer is a popular activity many Oregonians enjoy doing. Unfortunately, the Milwaukie Police Department (MPD) also sees an increase in bicycles being turned in as found property during the summer months. Most of the time, these bicycles are lost or stolen and the MPD would like to get the bikes to the rightful owners. Please remember to record your bicycle's serial number and any owner applied number along with a description (color, make, model, etc.) in a safe place, just in case you have to report your bicycle missing. This helps police officers and their support staff identify bicycles and return them to their owners.

The summer is going by fast and the new school year will be upon us in no time. Please be mindful of children walking, biking or using buses to get to school. Remember to obey school zone speeds, crosswalk laws and red flashing lights on school buses.

Code Corner: Invasive Species Alert



An invasive tree is spreading quite fast in Milwaukie called the Tree of Heaven. These leafy trees destroy foundations and sewer pipes, as well as produce toxins in the soil that prevent native plants from establishing themselves. They spread by seeds (325,000 to 350,000 per tree) that are paper thin and "helicopter down" as they fall from the tree, or by resprouting off of roots.

Please remove starts by digging them up entirely as soon as possible. If you have a large full grown tree in your yard, please consider getting rid of it and grinding the roots very soon.

City's Credit Rating for Library Bonds

Moody's Investors Service has assigned a Aa2 rating to the City of Milwaukie's \$9.2 million General Obligation (GO) Bonds, Series 2016, which will fund improvements to the Ledding Library. This rating will lead to lower interest rates on the bonds, helping the city save thousands of dollars over the life of the bonds.

Moody's has also affirmed the Aa2 on the city's outstanding \$3.5 million general obligations bonds and the Aa3 rating on the city's outstanding \$855,000 full faith and credit bonds. The Aa2 rating reflects the city's strong and stable financial position, management debt and pension burden, average wealth levels and participation in the Portland metropolitan economy.


