THEME: Architecture - 20th Century DATE: 1923
DESCRIPTION: Philip Streib was a Portland brewmeister and hotel owner, who opened Milwaukie's first independent home-owned bank - First State Bank of Milwaukie, in 1909. Streib became president and many residents of the Concord area were early stockholders. The bank was located on the corner of Main and Washington.

ROOF: Red tile multi-gable clipped with exposed rafters.
DOORS: Oak, paneled with round-headed multi-light window, flanked by sidelights.
WINDOWS: First: Fixed sash with decorative muntins, double hung window with decorative muntins in upper sash; Second: 4/1 double-hung window with vertical muntins.
MAIN ENTRANCE: Gable roof with elliptical arch.

NOTES: Chimney - stucco. Polygonal bay window - west elevation with tent roof
Outbuildings - stucco with red tile roof and clipped gable; Stone retaining wall.
Sunporch: Fixed sash, elongated windows with muntined transom windows.
