HISTORIC INTEREST:

THEME: Architecture - 19th Century DATE: ca 1880
DESCRIPTION: Shindler was the first mayor of Milwaukie. This house is known as the Shindler-Niedemeyer house. The 2 upstairs windows left used to be doors with each having a balcony. William Shindler was the owner, also had a furniture factory in Milwaukie. In 1903 he was Milwaukie's first elected Mayor. His late daughter, Rose, married Mr. Henry Niedemeyer. This property was especially known for its oldest and largest dogwood

ARCHITECTURAL INTEREST:

STYLE: Vernacular STORIES: 2
DATE: ca 1880 CONDITION: Fair ARCHITECT:
SIDING: Narrow beveled siding
ROOF: Steeples pitched gable, rake & corner boards
DOORS: Narrow w/oval glass (beveled glass)
WINDOWS: Elongated double hung 1/1 architrave molding. Polygonal bay w/flat roof (in feeling). Small casement above front porch.
MAIN ENTRANCE: Pedimented gable w/bracketed cornice, plain square posts w/modest capitals; Rear Entrance: very narrow 5 panel wood door.

NOTES: 1 1/2 story wing may have had dormer added later - wider plain molding windows are found in 1 1/2 story (east wing). East wing has encircling porch. Rain awnings above original windows. Original shutter on second.
