The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m.

Don asked if everyone had read the minutes from the previous meeting. Ray made a motion to accept the minutes. Mary seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously.

Chief – gave an update on the community assessment funds – currently we have \$8,490. It is not subject to roll-over at the end of the fiscal year, but he will check with the budget committee. We would like to put up two more posts/brackets for speed signs. The volume of photo radar citations has increased.

Noise ordinance – Council asked for community input. He would like members to discuss this with their NDA's and get back to him. There was a discussion regarding Tri-Met's construction zone.

Bicycles – we currently have 36 bikes to give away. 6 of 7 NDA's will contribute to buying helmets. Fire might be able to contribute some bicycles.

Women's self-defense class project – has been postponed for now.

Council asked him to provide a code of conduct for citizens on boards/committees.

Ray asked about the municipal court being moved to PSB – Chief said the project is still alive.

Milwaukie High School representatives talked about the video they've been working on regarding photo radar. They will send out a link to view it. They'd like to hear feedback.

Ray – Light Rail – funding should be coming in June and they'll be able to purchase the rest of the property they need. ODOT is going to do some reconfiguring on 99E this summer near Tacoma. They will also make the divider higher to discourage pedestrian crossing there. They're opening a field office in the Holman Building on Beta St. Milwaukie monthly meetings will change to the third Monday of the month at the field

office at 5:00 PM. They will be hiring additional fare inspectors and they've received a TSA grant to hire additional police officers.

Upcoming events:

Chief – we have purchased a container for prescription drug turn-ins that we'll keep in the lobby of PSB. It will be bolted to the floor.

Jason – WSMP – the Stanley project could be done next week. Island Station – they are negotiating with property owners. He gave a schedule of future projects. There was a discussion regarding projects.

Fire – said they will be making a concerted effort to stop fireworks this year.
