

That an assessment will be levied on all lots and parcels of land within such proposed improvement district, in proportion to the amount to which each lot will be benefitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that written remonstrance against the said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder on or before the 16th day of June, 1958.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police of Milwaukie, shall, within ten days from the passage of this Resolution, give notice of the passage of this Resolution, by posting a notice headed with the title "NOTICE OF SEWER CONSTRUCTION WORK" in three conspicuous places along Harrison Street, which said notices shall contain a copy of this resolution, and shall specify the time in which a remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible; NOW THEREFORE an emergency is declared to exist and this resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 13-1958

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore, by Ordinance No. 715 of said city duly passed and signed by the Mayor on the 19th day of May, 1958, did initiate proceedings to annex the territory hereinafter described, which is contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 22.120, 22.130, 22.140, 22.170 of Oregon Revised Statutes, and,

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, heretofore, by Ordinance No. 715 of said city duly passed and signed by the Mayor on the 19th day of May, 1958, did dispense with submitting the question of such annexation to the registered voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and did fix the date, place and time for a public hearing before it at which the registered voters of the city might appear and be heard upon the question of such annexation at the hour of 8:00 P.M. on the 9th day of June, 1958, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was published in the Milwaukie Review, a newspaper of general circulation in Milwaukie, Oregon, on May 22, 1958, and on May 29, 1958, and written notice of such hearing was posted in four public places in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for two successive weeks prior to the date of said hearings, and

WHEREAS, on the 9th day of June, 1958, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, a public hearing was held by the Council of said city at which hearing the registered voters of said city were given an opportunity to appear and be heard on the question of such annexation

of territory to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and .

WHEREAS, at such hearing, no registered voter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, appeared and made any objection to such annexation of said territory and

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 721 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, duly passed by the City Council of said city and signed by the Mayor of said city on the 9th day of June, 1958, the territory hereinafter bounded and described was declared to be annexed to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, upon the condition that the majority of the votes cast by the registered voters residing within said territory be in favor of such annexation, and,

WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 721 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and duly signed by the Mayor of said city on the 9th day of June, 1958, an annexation election was ordered to be held within such territory on the 11th day of July, 1958, submitting to the registered voters residing within said territory the question of whether or not said territory should be annexed to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of said Ordinance No. 721 of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, an annexation election was held in the said territory on the 11th day of July, 1958, between the hours of 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. on said day, and,

WHEREAS, at a special meeting called for that purpose on the 12th day of July, 1958, the Council of the City of Milwaukie did proceed to canvass the votes cast at such annexation election, and,

WHEREAS, it was determined by the Council of the City of Milwaukie at said special meeting that 142 votes were cast at said annexation election within said territory, of which 85 were in favor of the annexation of said territory to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and of which 57 were against the annexation of the said territory to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that a majority of all votes cast at said annexation election favored annexation of said territory to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, finds that all of the said proceedings relating to said annexation have been had and done pursuant to and in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 222 of Oregon Revised Statutes,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that by virtue of the foregoing and by virtue of the provisions of Chapter 222, Oregon Revised Statutes, that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, do, and it hereby does, PROCLAIM that the territory bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at the intersection of the north boundary of Section 25, T. 1 S., R. 1 E., W.M. with the easterly right-of-way boundary of the Southern Pacific Main Line Railway as originally purchased; thence following the boundary common to Sections 24 and 25, said Township and Range, East to the east boundary of 36th Street, which is also the west boundary of the City of Portland; thence South on the east boundary of said 36th Street and the west boundary of the City of Portland and the southerly extension thereof to the north boundary of Lot 11, Block 1, FLOSS ACRES, a Townplat recorded in Book 16, Page 21, RECORD OF TOWNPLATS for Clackamas County, Oregon; thence Southwesterly along the north boundary of said Block 1 and the extension thereof to the northeast corner of the William Meek Claim No. 50, T. 1 S., R. 1 E., W.M.; thence along the north boundary of the said William Meek Claim, West to its intersection with the east boundary of the Southern Pacific Main Line right-of-way as originally purchased; thence following said railway right-of-way Northwesterly to the place of beginning of the tract herein described.

being territory contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of

Milwaukie, Oregon, is annexed to the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 14-1958

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, TO CONSTRUCT SANITARY SEWERS IN ARDENWALD, COLE ADDITION AND WALNUT ADDITION.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to construct sanitary sewers along

36th AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Sherrett Avenue
ROCKVORST ROAD, from Roswell Avenue to 28th Street
28th AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Van Waters Avenue
28th STREET, from Van Waters Avenue to Sherrett Avenue
28th PLACE, from Roswell Avenue to Van Waters Avenue
29th AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Sherrett Avenue
30th AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Van Waters Avenue
and from Sherrett Street southerly a distance of
150 feet
31st AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Van Waters Avenue
and from Sherrett Street southerly a distance of
150 feet
32nd AVENUE, from Roswell Avenue to Sherrett Avenue
VAN WATERS AVENUE, from 28th Street to 32nd Avenue
SHERRETT STREET from 28th Street to 32nd Avenue

and to construct a TRUNK LINE SEWER along

SHORT STREET, from Beta Street to Stubb Street
STUBB STREET, from Short Street to the Easterly right-
of-way line of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company
Northerly along the easterly right-of-way line of the
Southern Pacific Railroad Company to Roswell Avenue
ROSWELL AVENUE, from the easterly right-of-way line of
the Southern Pacific Railroad Company to 36th Avenue.

AND WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for appropriate improvement to accomplish the above and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done,

AND WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimated in the office of the City Recorder,
