RESOLUTION NUMBER 20-1958

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE CALLING OF A SPECIAL ELECTION IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, ON NOVEMBER 4, 1958, FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, THE QUESTION OF ADOPTING A DOG CONTROL ORDINANCE PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL AND REFERRED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS OF SAID CITY.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, did, on the 13th day of October, pass an ordinance in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

ORDINANCE NUMBER 736

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF DOGS IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any owner or keeper of any dog or dogs in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, to allow or permit such dog or dogs to run at large on the streets, alleys or highways in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, unless accompanied by the owner or keeper of such dog or dogs.

Section 2. Any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon the conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of \$50.00.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection, at a special election to be called and held on November 4, 1958..."

and

WHEREAS, by said ordinance it is provided that it shall be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for their approval or rejection, at a special election to be held on November 4, 1958,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the following measure shall be submitted in the manner prescribed in this resolution to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at a special election to be held on November 4, 1958:

"PROHIBITING DOGS RUNNING AT LARGE. Purpose: Ordinance making it unlawful, unless they accompany them, for owners or keepers of dogs to allow them to run at large on Milwaukie's public thoroughfares."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this special election be and the same hereby is called to be held concurrently with and as a part of the state-wide regular election being held in the State of Oregon and in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on November 4, 1958.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the regular polling places designated by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, in the voting precincts in the City of Milwaukie hereby are designated as the polling places for the special election; the poll books adopted by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, as the poll books for the statewide regular election for the voting precincts in the City of Milwaukie hereby are adopted as the poll books for the special election; and the judges and clerks of election appointed by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, to serve at the statewide regular election hereby are designated as the judges and clerks of and for the special election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the judges and clerks shall hold their respective offices as designated for the statewide regular election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the polls for the special election shall be opened in each of the voting precincts at the same hour, and shall be kept open until the same hour, as the polls are opened and closed for the statewide regular election that will be held on the same day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that notice of the special election shall be given by posting notices thereof in three public places in each voting precinct within the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at least ten days prior to the date of election, and by publishing notice thereof once in the Milwaukie Review, the official city paper, at least ten days prior to the said election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the notice published in the said newspaper and the notices to be posted in three public places in each voting precinct shall be in substantially the following form:

NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

On November 4, 1958, in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from 8:00 A.M. till 8:00 P.M., a special city election will be held at which the following measure will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Milwaukie for their approval or rejection:



The full measure to be voted on is on file with the City Recorder at the Recorder's Office at the City Hall of Milwaukie, Oregon, and there available for inspection.

The city and county precincts within the City of Milwaukie will have uniform boundaries and the same election boards. The polling places in the City for the special election will be at the same places as provided by Clackamas County for the statewide regular election to be held on the same day, November 4, 1958, and to such places as the election boards may legally adjourn.

The City Council by resolution has appointed the identical officers appointed by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon, for the statewide regular election, as the judges and clerks of the special election to serve in each of the polling places in the respective precincts to which they are appointed by the County Court of Clackamas County, Oregon.
