

WHEREAS, the Dogwood Tree (Cornus nuttalli) is native to the City of Milwaukie, and

WHEREAS, the oldest and largest Dogwood Tree in the world is in the City of Milwaukie, and

WHEREAS, the popularity of the Dogwood tree can well be attested to by the number that are planted in the yards of the residents of the City of Milwaukie, and

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie is and should be considered the Dogwood City of the West, now therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, THAT

SECTION 1. The official flower of the City of Milwaukie shall be the Dogwood blossom (Cornus nuttalli, Cornus florida, Cornus florida rubra) to be used as an identifying emblem on official uniforms, vehicles, stationery, publicity releases, etc., as deemed feasible by the City Administrator.

SECTION 2. The Dogwood blossom emblem shall be recommended for use by civic, fraternal, service, commercial, and other recognized organizations in the Milwaukie area in the same manner as suggested in Section 1.

SECTION 3. The official pseudonym (nickname) of the City of Milwaukie shall be The Dogwood City of The West. This name to be used in conjunction with the official City Flower.
