RESOLUTION NUMBER 27-1959

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, TO CONSTRUCT CURBS ALONG BOTH SIDES OF SELLWOOD STREET FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH 32nd STREET TO ITS INTERSECTION WITH 33rd STREET.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it expedient and necessary to construct curbs along both sides of Sellwood Street from its intersection with 32nd Street to its intersection with 33rd Street, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, has required from the City Engineer, plans and specifications for the appropriate improvement to accomplish the above, and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans and specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, the location and kind of improvement being as follows:

By the construction of curbs, along both sides of Sellwood Street from its intersection with 32nd Street to its intersection with 33rd Street, all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the City Recorder, which plans and specifications are hereby referred to and made a part of this Resolution.

That the Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of such improvement is the sum of \$_____.

That the district liable to be assessed for said improvement is as follows:

LOTS 23, 24, 25, 26, BLOCK 7, QUINCY ADDITION.
LOTS 1, 2, 3, 4, BLOCK 12, QUINCY ADDITION.

The Engineer's estimated cost per lineal foot for curbs is \$_____.

That an assessment will be levied on all lots within the proposed district where said curbs are to be constructed, in proportion to the amount to which each lot is benefitted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that written remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder on or before the _____ 1959.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, shall, within ten days from the adoption of this Resolution, give notice of the adoption hereof by posting notices headed with the title "NOTICE OF CURB CONSTRUCTION WORK" in three public and conspicuous places along said portion of Sellwood Street, which said notices shall contain a copy of this Resolution and shall specify the time in which remonstrances against the proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder; and that the City Council will hear such remonstrances as may be filed on the _____ day of _____ 1959, at the hour of _____ o'clock P.M., in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible so as to take advantage of weather and other conditions in the construction of said improvement, NOW THEREFORE, AN EMERGENCY IS DECLARED TO EXIST, and this Resolution shall go into full force and effect immediately after its passage.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 28-1959

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore by Ordinance Number 758 of the said city duly passed and signed by the Mayor on the 11th day of August, 1959, did initiate proceedings to annex the territory hereinafter described, which is contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, pursuant to the provisions of Sections 22.120, 22.130, 22.140, 22.150, and 22.170 of Oregon Revised Statutes, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, by Ordinance Numbered 758 of said city duly passed and signed by the Mayor on the 11th day of August, 1959, did dispense with submitting the question of such annexation to the registered voters of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and did fix the date, place and time for a public hearing before it at which the registered voters of the city might appear and be heard upon the question of such annexation at the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M. on the 14th day of September, 1959, in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was published in the Milwaukie Review, a newspaper of general circulation in Milwaukie, Oregon, on September 17th, 1959 and on October 8th, 1959, and written notice of such hearing was posted in four public places in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for two successive weeks prior to the date of said hearings, and

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of September, 1959, at the hour of 8:00 P.M. in the Council Chamber of the City Hall, 926 Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, a public hearing was held by the Council of said city at which hearing the registered voters of said city were given an opportunity to appear and be heard on the question of such annexation of territory to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and
