RESOLUTION NUMBER 3-1937

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING THE MINIMUM HOURLY WAGES TO BE PAID
EMPLOYEES (EXCLUSIVE OF EXECUTIVE, SUPERVISORY AND ADMINISTRATIVE
EMPLOYEES) WHO WILL ENGAGE IN WORK ON THE NEW CITY HALL (FEDERAL
EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATION OF PUBLIC WORKS OREGON DOCKET 1225).

WHEREAS, the Federal Emergency administration of Public Works
requires that the City establish and determine the minimum hourly
wages to be paid on the construction of its new City Hall, and

WHEREAS, one of the requirements of said Federal Emergency
Administration of Public Works is that such determination must be
in accordance with the rates prevailing for a work of a similar
nature in the locality of Milwaukie and vicinity, and

WHEREAS, the City, acting through its Council, has investigated and determined what the minimum hourly rates prevailing in this locality for the work to be done in connection with the construction of said City Hall are

Now Therefore

Be it, and it is hereby, resolved:

Section 1. That the minimum hourly wages to be paid employees (exclusive of executive, supervisory and administrative employees) who will engage in work on the new City Hall to be built with the assistance of the United States of America, acting through its agency, the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works, (Docket Oregon 1225) be, and they are hereby, established and determined in accordance with the following schedule:
