RESOLUTION NUMBER 3, 1950

BE IT RESOLVED, that the United States National Bank of Portland, Oregon at its Head Office in the City of Portland, County of Multnomah, State of Oregon, is hereby designated as safekeeping depository for all securities put up by any bank or banker, in accordance with the laws of the State of Oregon to secure the deposits of this body in any such bank or with any such banker;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer of this body is hereby authorized, to accept from said depository its safekeeping receipt on its Form 766 (as now numbered) for any securities thus deposited in safekeeping;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer of this corporation be authorized to execute, in writing, written consent, for the exchange of securities withdrawal of securities and substitution of other securities in exchange therefor, of equal market value;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that when any such deposit by this body with any bank so securing the same, has been paid in full, the Treasurer be authorized to give her written consent to The United States National Bank of Portland, Oregon, releasing all of such securities so held in safekeeping to such depository;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Treasurer of this body is hereby authorized and empowered to lodge for safekeeping with The United States National Bank of Portland, Oregon, any securities owned by this body, taking therefor safekeeping receipt of The United States National Bank of Portland, Oregon, upon its Form 205 (as now numbered);

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all written consents executed by said Treasurer shall be countersigned by the Mayor of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, be, and they hereby are, authorized to certify the foregoing resolution the The United States National Bank of Portland, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 4, 1950

WHEREAS, by action of the Federal Communications Commission the Metropolitan Portland Area has been denied television facilities by its action under the "freeze" order of the said Commission on the basis of congestion of television channels; and

WHEREAS, the City of Portland is the largest city in the United States that does not have television facilities, nor are such facilities available from other metropolitan areas, therefore no congestion exists in this area, and

WHEREAS, petitions have been circulated addressed to the Oregon Congressional delegation, and that the Council of the City of Milwaukie should join in such petition as well as a direct petition to the Federal Communications Commission, inasmuch as the lack of television facilities may well result in serious if not permanent injury to this area to compete with the principal rivals in the field of commerce, industry, and entertainment, now; therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Council by this resolution endorse the efforts now being made to obtain television for the City of Portland and the area adjacent thereto; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the City Council does by resolution respectfully petition the Federal Communications Commission to authorize and permit applications to be made for the establishment of television facilities in the City of Portland, and that the current "freeze" on licenses be removed in so far as Portland Area applications are concerned inasmuch as no congestion exists in this area and that applications are made only for black and white television, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a certified copy of this resolution be addressed to Honorable Wayne L. Morse and the Honorable Guy Gordon, U. S. Senators for Oregon, and to the Honorable Walter L. Norblad, Representative from 1st District in Congress; and that also a copy be sent to Federal Communications Commission, Washington D.C. and that a copy be entered upon the minutes of this meeting.
