BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all vehicles proceeding in a southerly direction along 42nd Street be and they hereby are required to come to a complete stop before entering the intersection of 42nd Street with Railroad Avenue in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and that a proper stop sign be posted at an appropriate place to indicate the required stop; and



Passed by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, this twelfth day of December, 1960.


