

Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby approved and adopted:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

(1). That said street be improved from the South line of Elmer Street to the North line of Wister Street.

(2). The Street shall be brought to a grade as established and a minimum of 4 cubic feet per lineal foot of pit-run gravel shall be placed in the center of the street for a space of 8 feet in width. The gravel to be applied under the supervision and direction of the City Engineer.

(3). The Engineer shall set all grade stakes that are necessary and as are customary for the putting in of sidewalks and curbs. The laying of sidewalks to be optional with the individual property owner and if so laid shall be at said property owners expense and may be laid by himself or a contractor. Sidewalks to be cement, 4 feet in width and not less than 4 inches thick, to be laid at a distance of 18 inches from the property line. Curbs where put in shall be 18 inches deep, 8 inches on bottom and 6 inches on the top, and the face of the same shall be 14 feet from the property line. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution. Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten days from the 16th day of July, 1920.

The Town Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Resolution and Notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 4-1920

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF 24TH STREET IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of 24th Street according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, and, whereas, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted:

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie by its Council to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

(1). That said 24th Street be improved by paving thereof, twenty-four (24) feet in width, connecting with the sixteen foot pavement in Harrison Street and extending northerly along the center line of said 24th Street (curbing and sidewalks already laid) for a distance of five hundred and one (501) feet, more or less.

(2). The street shall be sub-graded to allow for the laying of said paving as staked out and marked by the City Engineer.

(3). The pavement shall be Bituminous Macadam by the penetration method. The said pavement to be as follows:- Bottom course to be of crushed rock, or crushed rock and pit-run gravel; sizes and thickness to be determined by the City Engineer; second course to be of crushed rock, sizes and thickness to be determined by City Engineer. The

Bituminous binder shall be hot asphalt to be proportioned and applied as determined by the City Engineer: seal coat to be of hot asphalt and to be applied and amount determined by City Engineer. Topping to be of stone chips. To support the sides of the pavement where there are no curbs, planking or crushed rock may be used. The necessity of the same, if any, to be determined by the City Engineer. A drain to carry the water across the east side of 24th Street at Harrison Street may be provided if necessary. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder and approved by this resolution. Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten days from the 22nd day of July, 1920.

The recorder is hereby directed to cause this Notice and Resolution to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1920

"WHEREAS, on the 1st day of June, 1920, at a meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, regularly called and held, a resolution was unanimously adopted, reciting that the said Council deemed it necessary and expedient and for the best interests of said Town of Milwaukie to acquire jurisdiction over a certain strip of county road lying within the corporate limits of said Town, and described as follows: The South Forty (40) feet thereof as originally laid out, lying between the northeast corner of the Lot Whitcomb Donation Land Claim, and a point in the North line of said Donation Land Claim distant fifteen and one-half (15½) rods west from said corner of said Donation Land Claim:

And Whereas, the said town by resolution requested the County of Clackamas, State of Oregon, and the County Court thereof to surrender to said town jurisdiction over the above described portion of said road:

And Whereas, pursuant to said resolution, a petition was filed by said town, addressed to said county court, embodying the said resolution, and the foregoing request:

And Whereas, thereafter such proceedings were had in said County Court; that on the 8th day of October, 1920, said County Court made and entered an order in compliance with the prayer of said petition, offering to surrender to said town jurisdiction over said portion of County Road No. 132, provided that such offer should be accepted by said town by appropriate resolution or ordinance within thirty days from the date of said order;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the council and the mayor of said Town of Milwaukie, that the aforesaid offer of the County of Clackamas to surrender jurisdiction over said portion of County Road as set forth in said order be and the same hereby is accepted, and that said Town of Milwaukie henceforth assume jurisdiction over the above described portion of County Road No. 132, for its improvement, construction and repair, and for the levying and collection of assessments therefor, and for the control thereof, and over the same to the same extent and in like manner as it has jurisdiction of and controls the public streets and alleys of said town by virtue of the provisions of its charter and the laws of the State of Oregon:

And Be It Further Resolved, that the acceptance of said offer be communicated to said County of Clackamas and to the County Court thereof in compliance with the provisions of said order by filing in the office of the County Clerk of said County a certified copy of this resolution."
