WHEREAS, the said Private First Class WILLIAM BLOCK, was a resident of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and leaves therein survivors; and

WHEREAS, Private First Class WILLIAM BLOCK, had a commendable record in the armed forces of the United States of America and has given his full measure of devotion to his country;



Adopted by the Council of the City of Milwaukie this 11th day of March, 1968.




