

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1913

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been made to the Council concerning the manner in which the Milwaukie Tavern is being conducted and, WHEREAS, the council have received information that the proprietor of the said tavern has violated the law and ordinances of the Town of Milwaukie in conducting said tavern, disturbing the peace and quiet of said Town, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the Milwaukie Tavern is a nuisance and is hereby declared to be such, and that the liquor license of Earl Alphin, the proprietor thereof, be and the same is hereby revoked, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Recorder be and hereby is instructed to cancel said liquor license and return to said Earl Alphin the money paid by him to the Town for said license less the amount due the Town for the time the said license was in force.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 6-1913

WHEREAS, the property owners whose property abuts on Laurel Avenue have presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie for the extension of Laurel Avenue, from Blane Street West to Railroad Avenue, said extension to be sixty feet in width, and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie deems it expedient and necessary that said extension be made, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the City Engineer proceed, and he is hereby instructed to make a survey of the proposed extension of Laurel Avenue, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said extension, and of the boundaries thereof, and of the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefor.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 7-1913

WHEREAS, the property owners whose property abuts on Harrison Street have presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie for the widening of Harrison Street along the property belonging to the Bonnett Heirs so as to conform with the plans and survey made by Louis Campbell for the improvement of said Street, AND

WHEREAS, the council of the Town of Milwaukie deem it expedient and necessary that said Street be widened as petitioned for,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the City Engineer proceed, and he is hereby instructed to make a survey of the proposed widening of Harrison Street, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said widening, and of the boundaries thereof, and the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefore.
