BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of Police of the City of Milwaukie shall within ten days from the passage of this resolution, give notice of the passage of this resolution by posting a notice headed with the title "NOTICE OF CURB AND SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION WORK ALONG MONROE AND CAMPBELL STREETS" in three conspicuous places on each of the following Streets, Monroe Street and Campbell Street; which said notice shall contain a copy of this resolution, and shall specify the time within which a remonstrance against said proposed improvement may be filed with the City Recorder.

AND WHEREAS, it is necessary that said improvement be made as soon as possible; and it is necessary to take advantage of weather conditions in the construction of said improvement; NOW THEREFORE an emergency is declared to exist and this resolution shall go into effect and force immediately upon its adoption.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1949

A Resolution declaring the intention of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, to construct, repair, and re-lay curbs and sidewalks along both sides of the street in the City of Milwaukie, as hereinafter specified.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie deems it necessary and expedient to construct and lay sidewalks and curbs where none now exist, and where such curbs and sidewalks now exist but do not conform to the standards, as established by the City of Milwaukie as to grade, alignment or quality, between the following termini;

Beginning at the intersection of Harrison Street with the easterly line of 23rd Street; running thence easterly along Harrison Street to the westerly line of 42nd Street.

AND WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie has required from the City Engineer plans and specifications for the appropriate improvement to accomplish the above and an estimate of the cost of the work to be done.

AND WHEREAS, the City Engineer has heretofore filed such plans, specifications and estimates in the office of the City Recorder.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Milwaukie, that the above mentioned plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer now on file with the Recorder and found to be satisfactory and they hereby are approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Council of the City of Milwaukie does hereby declare its intention and purpose to make such improvement, the location and kind of improvement being as follows;

By the construction of certain sidewalks and curbs wherever none now exist, and where the same now exist but do not conform with the standards as established by the City of Milwaukie as to grade, alignment or quality; all to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file with the City Recorder, which said plans and specifications hereby are referred to and made a part of this resolution.

Said curbs and sidewalks to be constructed along the following line and termini;

On both sides of Harrison Street; Beginning at the intersection of Harrison Street with the easterly line of 23rd Street; running thence easterly along both sides of Harrison Street to the westerly line of 42nd Street.

The City Engineer's estimate of the probable cost of such improvement is the sum of \$18,720.00.

That the boundaries of the District liable to be assessed for the cost of the proposed improvement are as follows;

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of 23rd Street, which is 100 feet distant northerly and at right angles to the northerly line of Harrison Street; thence easterly and parallel with the northerly line of Harrison Street and 100 feet distant northerly therefrom to the westerly line of 42nd Street; thence southerly along the westerly line of 42nd Street to a point that is 100 feet distant southerly from the southerly line of Harrison Street; thence westerly and parallel with the southerly line of Harrison Street and 100 feet distant southerly therefrom to the easterly line of 23rd Street; thence northerly along the easterly line of 23rd Street to the point of beginning.

That the City Engineer's estimate of the cost per each front foot for curb where the same will be constructed or reconstructed is \$1.25; and the City Engineer's estimate of the cost per each square foot of sidewalk, where said sidewalk will be constructed is \$0.30. And where the said sidewalks are reconstructed is \$0.40.

That an assessment will be levied on all lots and parcels of land within the said proposed assessment district where the said curb will be constructed or reconstructed in proportion to the amount to which each lot or parcel of land will be benefited; and where the sidewalk will be constructed or reconstructed, in proportion to the amount to which each lot or parcel of land will be benefited.
