

(3). The gutter lines to be 13 feet from the center of said street.

(4). Pit run gravel for a width of 12 feet and 8 inches in depth to be spread along the center of said street, except at the south end of the street additional gravel shall be spread to allow for a turning area.

(5). Provision to be made for any necessary drainage of water across said street and for any necessary crosswalks as the City Engineer shall deem necessary. All of said work to be done in accordance with the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this Resolution. Remonstrances against said improvement may be filed in writing with the Recorder of said Town on or before ten days from the 16th day of June, 1923.

The Recorder is hereby directed to cause this Notice and Resolution to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1923

Whereas, certain owners of real property abutting on 27th Street, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, have presented a petition, properly signed, to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the extension of 27th Street in said Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from a point beginning at the intersection of the south line of Henneman's Acres with the center line of the present 27th Street, in said Henneman's Acres, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, thence south 0 degrees 24' east 639 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of Lake Road, said point being north 0 degrees 24' east 31 feet, more or less, and south 57 degrees east 276.50, more or less, from the southwest corner of a tract of land, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, owned by Nettie Olsen, which property is described in deed from Gus Simon and Belle Simon to Nettie Olsen, and recorded in Book 98 on pages 113 and 114, Record of Deeds of Clackamas County, Oregon. Said extension of 27th Street to be 50 feet in width for its full length and to be a continuation of the present 27th Street.

And, whereas, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, deems it necessary that said extension be made as petitioned for:

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, that the City Engineer proceed, and he hereby is instructed and directed to make a survey of the proposed extension of 27th Street, and to make a plat of the same, and a written report containing a full and complete description of said proposed extension and of the boundaries thereof, and the portions of each lot and tract of land to be appropriated therefor, and file the same with the Recorder of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 6-1923

Whereas, on the 1st day of June, 1914, the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, levied an assessment upon and against two parcels of land in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, belonging to the L. B. Menefee Lumber Company, to pay its portion of the costs of the improvement of Front Street in said Town, and

Whereas, some doubt has arisen as to the validity of said assessment and the lien created there against said property, and

Whereas, the L. B. Menefee Lumber Company has offered the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, the sum of \$350.00, as a compromise and in full satisfaction and settlement of said lien against said property, and

Whereas, the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, deeming it to be to the best interest of said Town to accept said offer of \$350.00, as a compromise and in full satisfaction and settlement of said assessment and the lien created thereby:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, that said Town accept the sum of \$350.00 as full settlement and satisfaction of said assessment and the lien created thereby against said property of the L. B. Menefee Lumber Company, and the Recorder is hereby instructed and directed to satisfy said lien against said property in the Lien Docket of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 1-1924

Whereas, the report of the appraisers appointed to assess benefits and damages on the proposed extension of 27th Street, having heretofore been adopted by ordinance by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Recorder be and hereby is directed to enter in the Docket of City Liens of the Town of Milwaukie the respective sums of benefits over damages so assessed by said appraisers in said report upon each particular lot or parcel of land, and the names of the owners benefited and assessed, in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 2-1924

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the Town of Milwaukie enter into a contract with the City of Portland for supplying the Town of Milwaukie with bull run water by the City of Portland for a period of two years from the 1st day of December, 1923. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Recorder be and hereby are instructed and directed to execute, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, the proposed contract with the City of Portland heretofore read.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 3-1924

RESOLUTION DECLARING 27TH STREET OPENED AND EXTENDED FROM A POINT AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE SOUTH LINE OF HENNEMAN'S ACRES IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, WITH THE CENTER LINE OF THE PRESENT 27TH STREET, THENCE SOUTH 0 DEGREES 24' EAST 639 FEET, MORE OR LESS, TO A POINT IN THE NORTH LINE OF LAKE ROAD.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, that 27th Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, be and hereby is opened and extended from a point at the intersection of Henneman's Acres, in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, with the center line of the present 27th Street, thence south 0 degrees 24' east 639 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of Lake Road. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the real property required therefor, as shown by the Report of the City Engineer, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the public use.
