

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5-1951

WHEREAS, it has been recommended by Milwaukie Sportsman's Club and the State Police that the City of Milwaukie establish a fish preserve for the use and pleasure of juveniles in the Milwaukie area, and

WHEREAS, said Sportsman's Club and State Police will assist the City of Milwaukie in stocking and policing the preserve,

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: That the City of Milwaukie set aside that portion of Johnson Creek which lies within the city limits of Milwaukie and south of the bridge at Road A, Kellogg Park, as a fish preserve during the summer months of 1951, with the privilege of fishing therein to be limited to juveniles under the age of fourteen years only, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the bag limit, days and hours for fishing by said juveniles, shall be determined by a committee composed of the City Manager of Milwaukie, a member of the Milwaukie Sportman's Club and a member of the State Police.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 6-1951

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO MAKE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL FUNDS FOR THE PLANNING OF A STORM SEWER SYSTEM IN MILWAUKIE.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, herein called the "applicant", after thorough consideration of the various aspects of the problem and study of available data has hereby determined that the construction of certain public works, generally described as a storm sewer system for the City of Milwaukie is desirable and in the public interest and to that end it is necessary that action preliminary to the construction of said works be taken immediately; and

WHEREAS, under the terms of Public Law 352, 81st. Congress, approved October 13, 1949, the United States of America has authorized the making of advances to public bodies to aid in defraying the cost of architectural engineering, and economic investigations and studies, surveys, designs, plans, working drawings, specifications, procedures, and other action preliminary to the construction of public works (exclusive of housing); and

WHEREAS, the applicant has examined and duly considered such act and the applicant considers it to be in the public interest and to its benefit to file an application under said act and to authorize other action in connection therewith;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the governing body of said applicant, as follows:

1. That the construction of said public works is essential to and is to the best interest of the applicant, and to the end that such public works may be provided as promptly as practicable it is desirable that action preliminary to the construction thereof be undertaken immediately;
2. That Thomas D. Telford, City Manager, be hereby authorized to file in behalf of the applicant an application (in form required by the United States and in conformity with said act) for an advance to be made by the United States to the applicant to aid in defraying the

planning cost preliminary to the construction of such public works, which shall consist generally of the preparation of complete plans and specifications for the construction of a city-wide storm sewer system within the City Limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon.

3. That if such advance be made the applicant shall provide or make necessary arrangements to provide such funds, in addition to the advance, as may be required to defray the cost of such action preliminary to the construction of the public works;

4. The said representative is hereby authorized to furnish such information and take such other action as may be necessary to enable the applicant to qualify for the advance;

5. That the officer designated in the preceding paragraph is hereby designated as the authorized representative of the applicant for the purpose of furnishing to the United States such information, data, and documents pertaining to the application for an advance as may be required; and otherwise to act as the authorized representative of the applicant in connection with this application.

6. That certified copies of this resolution be included as part of the application for an advance to be submitted to the United States.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 7-1951

WHEREAS, War Housing Project Oregon No. 35023, known as Kellogg Park, Clackamas County, Oregon, consisting of 600 housing units owned by the Federal Government and operated under a lease agreement by the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, lies within the city limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States passed an Act known as the Housing Act of 1950, setting forth the procedures for the abandonment of War Housing Projects such as Kellogg Park Project, Milwaukie, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, said Act provides that all vacancies occurring after March 31, 1952, shall not be reoccupied, which means that all units becoming vacant after said date will be closed and boarded up unless Congress amends this Act, and

WHEREAS, Congressman Walter Norblad from Oregon introduced a Bill in the House of Representatives authorizing the transfer of Kellogg Park War Housing Project to the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, Oregon, and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the County of Clackamas, Oregon, has publicly stated that it will continue to operate the 600 housing units of Kellogg Park Housing Project as a community service until such time as the houses can be replaced by private capital or until there is no longer a need for housing in this area, and

WHEREAS, an exhaustive survey of available rental housing in the area adjacent to Kellogg Park Housing Project reveals that approximately only 60 of the 600 families now residing in Kellogg Park could be provided for, and

WHEREAS, eviction by the Government of the 600 families now residing in Kellogg Park Housing Project on or before July 1, 1952, the deadline date as set by the Housing Act of 1950, will create a serious problem in the City of Milwaukie, and the population of Kellogg Park War Housing Project is approximately one half of the population of the City of Milwaukie according to the 1950 census.
