What is CERT? Community Emergency Response Team

CERT training focuses on increasing the level of safety for those individuals who will step forward to assist their neighborhood and community after a disaster. CERT promotes a partnership between emergency services and the community members they serve.

In the wake of a disaster, emergency personnel and their resources may be overwhelmed by the response needs in the community. CERT training gives individuals a glimpse into the 'System' designed to save lives in the most efficient and effective manner possible and provides some life-saving tools to assist yourself, your family, your neighbors and your community.

The training, taught by FEMA certified CERT trainers and subject specialists, is available for all citizens who are interested in disaster and emergency preparedness. Physical agility for lifting, carrying and standing or walking for long periods is necessary.

CERT CLASSROOM AND PRACTICAL COURSE

This 24 hour long course includes both classroom and hands-on practical application of the FEMA training materials and is held both indoors and out regardless of weather.

Class Session Topics

The basic CERT course covers

- **Disaster Preparedness**
- **Disaster Triage and First Aid**
- **Fire Prevention and Suppression; Hazardous Materials**
- **Light Search and Rescue**
- **CERT Organization and Operations**
- **Terrorism**
- **Disaster Psychology**

The 24 hour class consists of classroom instruction, videos, and practical application of course materials including putting out a small fire, search and rescue operations, medical operations and safe victim extraction exercises.
