

Minutes for Historic Milwaukie NDA Meeting for May 13, 2013

Light Rail Update: Claudia and Stacy provided information on the street closure planned for June 30 and additional one planned for Hwy 99 in August for one weekend and detours through the neighborhood. The closure at Harrison and at Park Ave would bring north and southbound traffic on Oatfield and Lake. There was a lengthy discussion about the impacts of the closure, truck traffic redirects and use of Lake to connect through traffic to Hwy 224. More details will be discussed at the monthly light rail meeting and communication/signage in advance for commuters.

Police Update: Captain Bartol distributed the crime stats for the prior month. Jean asked if they were making any progress with the number of police calls at Springcreek Apts. Steve advised that he had reviewed the prior police calls for Springcreek compared to apartment complexes of similar size. He noted that they had 195 calls in 2012 and 65 calls for one in Linwood. Steve will meet with mgmt/owner to discuss the overall improvement but still need to address the ongoing calls, more attention still required.

Steve advised that the Tri-Met was issued a \$500 citation for a noise violation for PLMR.

City Update: Katie Newell, provided the city update.

- TSP open house will be held on June 3 at 5:30 at the Milwaukie Christian Church
- The Monroe Bike Greenway grant will be discussed at the June 4 city council meeting
- The Library survey needs assessment was paid for by the Library Foundation

-Harrison Street water project taking place this summer along with the clay pipe replacement project

-First Friday will begin in June

TSP Update: Jean summarized the items/concerns that we have with the TSP and the need to have additional public comment in order to ensure that the neighborhood needs could be incorporated into the TSP was part of the update. She noted that the Monroe Bike greenway needs to be vetted through those neighborhoods that will be impacted. There was discussion about the bike greenway grant and the TSP and the forms that were completed to address neighborhood traffic impacts.

Sign Toppers: Dion provided an update on the neighborhood sign toppers. She met several times with the student from Milwaukie High School on the design for the sign topper and would bring several to the next meeting for the NDA to discuss and select. Beth has provided some guidance on what the process is to place the signs. Dion advised that the placement of the signs would be throughout the neighborhood at entry points from Hwy 99 and Hwy224. She asked that the neighborhood approve funding for 1,800 which would allow for 17-20 signs depending on the design(75.00-85.00 per sign) and then installation costs would be determined by City sign dept. Ed made a motion to earmark 1,800 for the signs and Ray seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

NDA Elections: Dion advised that the Chair, Vice Chair, Sec and Treasures positions were open. Jean expressed interest in Chair, Scott Barbur as vice chair and Ray as Sec/Treas. Ed made a motion for the nominations, Ray seconded. Motion passed.
