The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Dave asked if everyone had reviewed the minutes from the last meeting. Mary made a motion to approve the minutes. Dave seconded the motion. Agreed unanimously.

Chief – talked about the recent arrest of one of our officers for domestic violence. The officer has been placed on administrative leave with pay. If he is found guilty he will be unable to carry a firearm and could not be a police officer. If he is acquitted or the charges are dropped there will be an internal investigation. Mary asked what the P.D.'s policy is for domestic violence. The Chief said we are mandatory reporters – if they witness an incident they have to report it. The City has an employee assistance program that provides counseling/psychologists that specialize in working with law enforcement. The D.A.'s office has a task force that deals with domestic violence.

Chief – all but one of the High Star traffic tracking units was stolen and the remaining unit is not functioning at the moment. We're looking into having it repaired.

Chief – prescription drug turn-in project is set for April 10th. The Providence Milwaukie Hospital will co-sponsor the event. They will help catalog the items and transport them. We will also have a shredder available. The info will be in the April Pilot.

Chief – abandoned vehicles – the street department has asked him about towing vehicles that have been sitting on City streets for long periods of time. He asked for feedback from the committee on this topic and asked that they bring it up with their NDA's.

Chief – we're conducting a traffic survey on Railroad Avenue. The school zone signs have been removed. There was a discussion regarding the speed limit. There was a discussion regarding transients and panhandlers. The Chief would like the members to go back to their NDA's and bring up this subject.

Chief – we have an opening in the Records Department – he will be interviewing four candidates tomorrow. We also received 180 applicants for the police officer position.

Chief – the Johnson Creek Residential Treatment Facility has started receiving residents. We are receiving paperwork on the residents and are working with the staff to obtain photos, info, etc.

Dave – the PSAC received an award at the North Clackamas Chamber of Commerce Community Safety Appreciation luncheon recently.

Light Rail – Ray said the conceptual design report is available now on the Tri-Met website. The design now calls for a reduction in the size of the park & rides, but they will have the ability to add on later if necessary. In May the environmental impact study will be published. .

NTMPSP – Brad said the P.D. is doing a traffic study on Railroad Avenue and once that is complete the info will go to ODOT.
Brad went over the traffic projects.

Officer of the Year dinner - a meeting with the Legion will be arranged for the week prior to the dinner. Dave sent out emails containing the info. Ticket sales are slow.

Milwaukie Emergency Preparedness Network update – Linda has a call in to the school district to ask what their policy is on naming schools as emergency shelters. She offered to help any of the NDA's in contacting churches and other businesses/organizations in their neighborhoods. They had an idea of placing a placard/decal of some sort in the window of residences who have a special needs person inside. Residents also need to make arrangements for their pets in case of emergency.

Ray – the North Clackamas School District is changing their policy on providing transportation for their students. They will be asking more kids to walk next year.

Kim – said Clackamas County was looking to expand Hillside Manor.
